abandon	Leave behind empty; move out of. <i>An attempt to persuade businesses not to abandon the area to inner city deprivation.</i>

dalliance	A casual romantic or sexual relationship. <i>MPs have the opportunity for dalliance as they are away from home for much of the week.</i>
dally	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Get busy don't dally.</i>
discard	Anything that is cast aside or discarded. <i>West led a heart and East was able to discard his club loser.</i>
disposal	The power to use something or someone. <i>Disposals of fixed and non current assets.</i>
dispose	Kill. <i>The dots are unevenly disposed.</i>
dump	A piece of land where waste materials are dumped. <i>An ammunitions dump.</i>
dumping	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. <i>The cyclist has eliminated all the competitors in the race.</i>
garbage	A worthless message. <i>Garbage littered the estate.</i>
inefficient	Not producing desired results; wasteful. <i>An inefficient campaign against drugs.</i>
jettison	The action of jettisoning something. <i>Six aircraft jettisoned their loads in the sea.</i>

junk	Junk bonds. <i>We need to clear out our junk room.</i>
landfill	Bury in a landfill. <i>Landfill sites.</i>
leaving	The act of departing.
litter	Give birth to a litter of animals. <i>The sitting room was littered with books.</i>
prodigality	Excessive spending.
recycle	Cause to repeat a cycle. <i>We must recycle the cardboard boxes.</i>
recycling	The act of processing used or abandoned materials for use in creating new products. <i>Every Monday we put our recycling out on the curb for pick up.</i>
refuse	Refuse to let have. <i>The car refused to start.</i>
residual	Relating to or indicating a remainder. <i>She has been awarded more than 4 5 million in residuals and profits from the highly successful television show.</i>
residue	A substance that remains after a process such as combustion or evaporation. <i>The residue of the country s colonial past.</i>
reuse	Use again after processing. <i>The ballast was cleaned ready for reuse.</i>
rubble	The remains of something that has been destroyed or broken up. <i>The tower is built of stone rubble faced with ashlar.</i>
scavenge	Remove unwanted substances from. <i>People sell junk scavenged from the garbage.</i>
squander	Spend thoughtlessly; throw away. <i>The team squandered several good scoring chances.</i>
trash	Worthless material that is to be disposed of. <i>Trade associations trashed the legislation as deficient.</i>
vestigial	Not fully developed in mature animals. <i>The vestigial wings of kiwis are entirely hidden.</i>
