<b>dally</b>	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Get busy don't <b>dally</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>discard</b></a>	Anything that is cast aside or discarded. <i>West led a heart and East was able to <b>discard</b> his club loser.</i>
<b>disposal</b>	The power to use something or someone. <i><b>Disposals</b> of fixed and non current assets.</i>
<b>dispose</b>	Kill. <i>The dots are unevenly <b>disposed</b>.</i>
<b>dump</b>	A piece of land where waste materials are dumped. <i>An <b>ammunitions dump</b>.</i>
<b>dumping</b>	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
<b>eliminate</b>	Eliminate from the body. <i>The cyclist has <b>eliminated</b> all the competitors in the race.</i>
<a href="#"><b>garbage</b></a>	A worthless message. <i><b>Garbage</b> littered the estate.</i>
<a href="#"><b>inefficient</b></a>	Not producing desired results; wasteful. <i>An <b>inefficient</b> campaign against drugs.</i>
<a href="#"><b>jettison</b></a>	The action of jettisoning something. <i>Six aircraft <b>jettisoned</b> their loads in the sea.</i>

<b>junk</b>	Junk bonds. <i>We need to clear out our <b>junk</b> room.</i>
<b>landfill</b>	Bury in a landfill. <i><b>Landfill</b> sites.</i>
<b>leaving</b>	The act of departing.
<b>litter</b>	Give birth to a litter of animals. <i>The sitting room was <b>littered</b> with books.</i>
<b>prodigality</b>	Excessive spending.
<b>recycle</b>	Cause to repeat a cycle. <i>We must <b>recycle</b> the cardboard boxes.</i>
<b>recycling</b>	The act of processing used or abandoned materials for use in creating new products. <i>Every Monday we put our <b>recycling</b> out on the curb for pick up.</i>
<b>refuse</b>	Refuse to let have. <i>The car <b>refused</b> to start.</i>
<b>residual</b>	Relating to or indicating a remainder. <i>She has been awarded more than 4 5 million in <b>residuals</b> and profits from the highly successful television show.</i>
<b>residue</b>	A substance that remains after a process such as combustion or evaporation. <i>The <b>residue</b> of the country s colonial past.</i>
<b>reuse</b>	Use again after processing. <i>The ballast was cleaned ready for <b>reuse</b>.</i>
<b>rubble</b>	The remains of something that has been destroyed or broken up. <i>The tower is built of stone <b>rubble</b> faced with ashlar.</i>
<b>scavenge</b>	Remove unwanted substances from. <i>People sell junk <b>scavenged</b> from the garbage.</i>
<b>squander</b>	Spend thoughtlessly; throw away. <i>The team <b>squandered</b> several good scoring chances.</i>
<b>trash</b>	Worthless material that is to be disposed of. <i>Trade associations <b>trashed</b> the legislation as deficient.</i>
<b>vestigial</b>	Not fully developed in mature animals. <i>The <b>vestigial</b> wings of kiwis are entirely hidden.</i>
