Tiredness or inactivity, especially when pleasurable.

lavish Sumptuously rich, elaborate, or luxurious.

**Lavish** praise.

Moving slowly and gently.

At a **lazy** pace.

The quality of movability by virtue of being free from attachment or other

**looseness** restraints.
