Definitions of "Wavy" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “wavy” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves.*
- *Divided or edged with a line formed of alternating shallow curves.*
- *Having waves.*
- *(of hair) having waves.*
- *Having a form or edge that smoothly curves in and out.*



Synonyms of "Wavy" as an adjective (14 Words)

- crinkled** Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves.
*A skirt in **crinkled** fabric.*
- crinkly** Full of creases or wrinkles; wrinkled.
*Brown **crinkly** paper.*
- curling** (of hair) making curls or having been made to curl.
- curly** (of hair) having curls or waves.
*They envied her naturally **curly** hair.*
- curved** Having or marked by a curve or smoothly rounded bend.
*The **curved** tusks of a walrus.*
- curving** Having or marked by a curve or smoothly rounded bend.
- curvy** (of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.
*A settee with only one **curvy** end.*
- meandering** Proceeding in a convoluted or undirected fashion.
*A brilliant sample of **meandering** discourse.*
- rippled** Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves.
*The **rippled** surface of the pond.*

squiggly	Wavy and twisting.
undulating	Having a smoothly rising and falling form or outline. <i>The valley s undulating contours.</i>
wavelike	Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves.
winding	Following a twisting or spiral course. Winding roads are full of surprises.
zigzag	Having the form of a zigzag veering alternately to right and left. <i>When chased by a predator some animals take a zigzag course.</i>



Usage Examples of "Wavy" as an adjective

- *She had long, wavy hair.*
- *The leaf has a wavy edge.*
- *Visual distortion that makes straight lines appear wavy.*
- *She had long wavy hair.*



Associations of "Wavy" (30 Words)

approximate

Close to the actual, but not completely accurate or exact.

*The **approximate** time was 10 o'clock.*

approximative

(of a method, description, etc.) giving only an approximation to something.

*A crudely **approximative** outline.*

asymmetric	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
asymmetrical	Having parts or aspects that are not equal or equivalent; unequal. <i>The church has an asymmetrical plan with an aisle only on one side.</i>
blond	Being or having light colored skin and hair and usually blue or grey eyes. Blond Scandinavians.
<u>bumpy</u>	Covered with or full of bumps. <i>Investors could be in for a bumpy ride.</i>
circular	Having a circular shape. <i>The reality of standard English rests on the circular argument that that is good which good users use.</i>
curly	(of hair) having curls or waves. <i>My hair is just naturally thick and curly.</i>
<u>distance</u>	Beat a horse by a distance. <i>They sped off into the distance.</i>
<u>erratic</u>	Having no fixed course. <i>An erratic comet.</i>
hair	Hairs collectively especially those growing on a person's head. <i>Thick black hairs on his huge arms.</i>
hilly	Having hills and crags. <i>A remote hilly district.</i>
<u>irregular</u>	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>Their involvement in irregular financial dealings.</i>
<u>jagged</u>	With rough, sharp points protruding. <i>Her jagged nerves.</i>
jaundice	Affect with or as if with jaundice. <i>Jealousy had jaundiced his judgment.</i>
line	Be in line with form a line along. <i>Laughter lines.</i>
lopsided	With one side lower or smaller than the other. <i>A lopsided grin.</i>
myopic	Lacking foresight or intellectual insight. <i>Myopic thinking.</i>
<u>orange</u>	A butterfly with mainly or partly orange wings. <i>A slice of orange.</i>

patchy	Not of the same quality throughout; inconsistent. <i>Your coursework was patchy.</i>
perm	Set the hair in a perm. <i>She perms her hair.</i>
proximity	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit. <i>Do not operate microphones in close proximity to television sets.</i>
sinuate	Having a wavy or sinuous margin; with alternate rounded notches and lobes.
stripe	Mark with stripes. <i>A pair of blue shorts with pink stripes.</i>
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed.</i>
unequal	A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level. <i>Unequal odds.</i>
uneven	(of a contest or contestants) not fairly matched as opponents. <i>The uneven distribution of resources.</i>
wanting	Inadequate in amount or degree. <i>Tested and found wanting.</i>
weal	Mark with a weal. <i>His neck was wealed and raw.</i>
yellow	Changed to a yellowish color by age. <i>He d better get back there quick and prove he s not yellow.</i>
