- Having a form or edge that smoothly curves in and out.






# Synonyms of "Wavy" as an adjective (14 Words)

crinkled	Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves. A skirt in <b>crinkled</b> fabric.
crinkly	Full of creases or wrinkles; wrinkled. Brown <b>crinkly</b> paper.
curling	(of hair) making curls or having been made to curl.
curly	(of hair) having curls or waves. They envied her naturally <b>curly</b> hair.
curved	Having or marked by a curve or smoothly rounded bend. The <b>curved</b> tusks of a walrus.
curving	Having or marked by a curve or smoothly rounded bend.
curvy	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves. A settee with only one <b>curvy</b> end.
meandering	Proceeding in a convoluted or undirected fashion. A brilliant sample of <b>meandering</b> discourse.
rippled	Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves. The <b>rippled</b> surface of the pond.



squiggly	Wavy and twisting.
undulating	Having a smoothly rising and falling form or outline. <i>The valley s <b>undulating</b> contours.</i>
wavelike	Uneven by virtue of having wrinkles or waves.
winding	Following a twisting or spiral course. <i>Winding</i> roads are full of surprises.
zigzag	Having the form of a zigzag veering alternately to right and left. When chased by a predator some animals take a <b>zigzag</b> course.







### Usage Examples of "Wavy" as an adjective

- She had long, wavy hair.
- The leaf has a wavy edge.
- Visual distortion that makes straight lines appear wavy.
- She had long wavy hair.

approximative
(of a method, description, etc.) giving only an approximation to something. A crudely approximative outline.



asymmetric	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
asymmetrical	Having parts or aspects that are not equal or equivalent; unequal. The church has an <b>asymmetrical</b> plan with an aisle only on one side.
blond	Being or having light colored skin and hair and usually blue or grey eyes. <b>Blond</b> Scandinavians.
<u>bumpy</u>	Covered with or full of bumps. Investors could be in for a <b>bumpy</b> ride.
circular	Having a circular shape. The reality of standard English rests on the <b>circular</b> argument that that is good which good users use.
curly	(of hair) having curls or waves. My hair is just naturally thick and <b>curly</b> .
<u>distance</u>	Beat a horse by a distance. They sped off into the <b>distance</b> .
<u>erratic</u>	Having no fixed course. An <b>erratic</b> comet.
hair	Hairs collectively especially those growing on a person s head. Thick black <b>hair</b> s on his huge arms.
hilly	Having hills and crags. A remote <b>hilly</b> district.
<u>irregular</u>	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>Their involvement in <b>irregular</b> financial dealings.</i>
<u>jagged</u>	With rough, sharp points protruding. Her <b>jagged</b> nerves.
jaundice	Affect with or as if with jaundice. Jealousy had <b>jaundice</b> d his judgment.
line	Be in line with form a line along. <i>Laughter <b>line</b>s.</i>
lopsided	With one side lower or smaller than the other. A <b>lopsided</b> grin.
myopic	Lacking foresight or intellectual insight. <i>Myopic</i> thinking.
<u>orange</u>	A butterfly with mainly or partly orange wings. A slice of <b>orange</b> .



patchy	Not of the same quality throughout; inconsistent. <i>Your coursework was <b>patchy</b>.</i>
perm	Set the hair in a perm. She <b>perm</b> s her hair.
<u>proximity</u>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit. Do not operate microphones in close <b>proximity</b> to television sets.
sinuate	Having a wavy or sinuous margin; with alternate rounded notches and lobes.
stripe	Mark with stripes. A pair of blue shorts with pink <b>stripe</b> s.
toothed	Having an irregularly notched or toothed margin as though gnawed. <i>Saw toothed</i> .
unequal	A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level. <b>Unequal</b> odds.
<u>uneven</u>	(of a contest or contestants) not fairly matched as opponents. <i>The <b>uneven</b> distribution of resources.</i>
wanting	Inadequate in amount or degree. <i>Tested and found <b>wanting</b>.</i>
weal	Mark with a weal. His neck was <b>weal</b> ed and raw.
<u>yellow</u>	Changed to a yellowish color by age. He d better get back there quick and prove he s not <b>yellow</b> .
