abide	Dwell. <i>If there is one thing I cannot abide it is a lack of discipline.</i>
be	Have an existence be extant. <i>He s a tough customer let him be.</i>
denigrate	Charge falsely or with malicious intent; attack the good name and reputation of someone. <i>Doom and gloom merchants who denigrate their own country.</i>
derogatory	Showing a critical or disrespectful attitude. <i>She tells me I m fat and is always making derogatory remarks.</i>
disparaging	Expressive of low opinion. <i>Disparaging remarks about the new house.</i>
 dwell	Think moodily or anxiously about something. <i>Groups of people still dwell in these caves.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>The majority of urban dwellers live in small apartments.</i>
eternally	Used to emphasize expressions of admiration, gratitude, etc. <i>His eternally optimistic attitude.</i>
existence	Continued survival. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous existences.</i>
existential	Of or as conceived by existentialism. <i>Formal logicians are not concerned with existential matters.</i>
existing	Existing in something specified. <i>Much of the beluga caviar existing in the world is found in the Soviet Union and Iran.</i>
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>

<u>habitat</u>	A person's usual or preferred surroundings. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i>
horizontally	In a horizontal direction. <i>Labels are placed horizontally on the cases.</i>
immortalize	Make famous forever. <i>This melody immortalized its composer.</i>
<u>incarnation</u>	The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation. <i>In a previous journalistic incarnation I worked at Westminster.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Strange notions inhabited her mind.</i>
inhabitant	A person or animal that lives in or occupies a place.
<u>lifelong</u>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>A lifelong Conservative.</i>
live	Continue to live through hardship or adversity. <i>Live coals.</i>
<u>living</u>	People who are still living. <i>The benefits of country living.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The book is value oriented throughout.</i>
outlast	Live or last longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will outlast youth.</i>
<u>pejorative</u>	Expressing disapproval. <i>Permissiveness is used almost universally as a pejorative term.</i>
populate	Fill with inhabitants. <i>The island is populated by scarcely 40 000 people.</i>
<u>presence</u>	The state of being present; current existence. <i>He felt the presence of an evil force.</i>
<u>reside</u>	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly reside in the semantic meaning.</i>
stay	A period of staying somewhere in particular of living somewhere temporarily as a visitor or guest. <i>We are staying in Detroit we are not moving to Cincinnati.</i>
<u>survive</u>	Continue to live and avoid dying. <i>He survived the cancer against all odds.</i>
