## Associations of "Way of thinking" (30 Words)

<b>analytical</b>	Relating to or using analysis or logical reasoning. <i>A suave <b>analytical</b> type who missed his calling as a lawyer.</i>
<b><u>architectural</u></b>	Relating to the art or practice of designing and constructing buildings. <i>He liked <b>architectural</b> plants particularly large spiky palms.</i>
<b>attitude</b>	Individuality and self-confidence. <i>She snapped her fingers with <b>attitude</b>.</i>
<b>cognitive</b>	Relating to cognition. <i>The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.</i>
<b><u>conceivable</u></b>	Capable of being imagined or grasped mentally. <i>A mass uprising was entirely <b>conceivable</b>.</i>
<b><u>conceive</u></b>	Judge or regard; look upon; judge. <i>The dam project was originally <b>conceived</b> in 1977.</i>
<b>creative</b>	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>The most important people in the mix will be <b>creatives</b> and direct marketing specialists.</i>
<b>deducible</b>	Capable of being deduced.
<b>deductive</b>	Characterized by or based on the inference of particular instances from a general law. <i>I used my <b>deductive</b> powers.</i>
<b>defeatist</b>	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so <b>defeatist</b>.</i>
<b>derogatory</b>	Showing a critical or disrespectful attitude. <i>She tells me I m fat and is always making <b>derogatory</b> remarks.</i>
<b>dialectic</b>	Of or relating to or employing dialectic. <i>The <b>dialectical</b> method.</i>

<b>dialectical</b>	Relating to the logical discussion of ideas and opinions. <i>A <b>dialectical</b> opposition between social convention and individual libertarianism.</i>
<b>disparaging</b>	Expressing the opinion that something is of little worth; derogatory. <i><b>Disparaging</b> remarks about the new house.</i>
<b>imaginable</b>	Possible to be thought of or believed. <i>The most spectacular views <b>imaginable</b>.</i>
<b>logic</b>	Logical operations collectively. <i>It made a certain kind of <b>logic</b>.</i>
<b>manner</b>	The way a motor vehicle handles or performs. <i>Her dignified <b>manner</b>.</i>
<b>means</b>	Financial resources; income. <i>Resolving disputes by peaceful <b>means</b>.</i>
<b>mentality</b>	The capacity for intelligent thought. <i>I had inherited not only my father's blood but his bourgeois <b>mentality</b> as well.</i>
<b>method</b>	A way of doing something, especially a systematic way; implies an orderly logical arrangement (usually in steps). <i>Labour intensive production <b>methods</b>.</i>
<b>methodology</b>	The system of methods followed in a particular discipline. <i>Courses in research <b>methodology</b> and practice.</i>
<b>minded</b>	(used in combination) mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Conservation <b>minded</b> citizens.</i>
<b>oriented</b>	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The book is value <b>oriented</b> throughout.</i>
<b>pejorative</b>	Expressing disapproval. <i>Permissiveness is used almost universally as a <b>pejorative</b> term.</i>
<b>politic</b>	Engage in political activity. <i>He was too <b>politic</b> to quarrel with so important a personage.</i>
<b>sagacious</b>	Having or showing keen mental discernment and good judgement; wise or shrewd. <i>Observant and thoughtful he was given to asking <b>sagacious</b> questions.</i>

**syllogism**

An instance of a form of reasoning in which a conclusion is drawn from two given or assumed propositions (premises); a common or middle term is present in the two premises but not in the conclusion, which may be invalid (e.g. all dogs are animals; all animals have four legs; therefore all dogs have four legs).

*This school of epistemology is highly advanced in **syllogism** and logical reasoning.*

**theory**

A well-substantiated explanation of some aspect of the natural world; an organized system of accepted knowledge that applies in a variety of circumstances to explain a specific set of phenomena.

*True in fact and **theory**.*

**think**

An instance of deliberate thinking.

***Think** good thoughts.*

**thought**

To a small extent; somewhat.

*I haven't given it much **thought**.*
