## Synonyms of "Wayfarer" as a noun (9 Words)

- drifter** A wanderer who has no established residence or visible means of support.
- gypsy** The Indic language of the Gypsies.  
*Why should she choose to wander the world with a penniless **gypsy** like me.*
- itinerant** A laborer who moves from place to place as demanded by employment.  
***Itinerant** traders.*
- journeyer** A traveler going on a trip.
- migrant** A person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions.
- nomad** A member of a people who have no permanent home but move about according to the seasons.  
*The **nomads** who roam the borderlands of Afghanistan.*

**traveller** A member of a community traditionally having an itinerant way of life, in particular an Irish Traveller.  
*Business **travellers**.*

**vagabond** Anything that resembles a vagabond in having no fixed place.  
*Pirate ships were **vagabonds** of the sea.*

**vagrant** A wanderer.  
*Most birders are hoping to find the wind blown **vagrants** of migration.*

**adventurous** Involving new ideas or methods.  
***Adventurous** pioneers.*

**airline** A pipe supplying air.  
***Airline** pilot.*

<b>airport</b>	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An <b>airport</b> thriller.</i>
<b>circumnavigate</b>	Avoid dealing with (something difficult or unpleasant). <i>He helped her to <b>circumnavigate</b> a frozen puddle.</i>
<b>cruise</b>	An ocean trip taken for pleasure. <i>A <b>cruise</b> liner.</i>
<b>embark</b>	Go on board. <i>She <b>embarked</b> upon a new career.</i>
<b><u>expedition</u></b>	The people involved in an expedition. <i>An <b>expedition</b> was sent to explore Mars.</i>
<b>exploration</b>	Thorough examination of a subject. <i>An <b>exploration</b> of the African interior.</i>
<b>explorer</b>	A commercial browser. <i>A polar <b>explorer</b>.</i>
<b><u>flight</u></b>	A formation of aircraft in flight. <i>An eagle in <b>flight</b>.</i>
<b>guided</b>	Conducted by a guide. <i>A <b>guided</b> tour of the castle.</i>
<b><u>international</u></b>	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. <i>Large <b>international</b> hotels.</i>
<b>itinerary</b>	A planned route or journey. <i>His <b>itinerary</b> included an official visit to Canada.</i>
<b>itinerate</b>	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of <b>itinerating</b> magistrates was made.</i>
<b>journey</b>	Undertake a journey or trip. <i>I was excited with my character's <b>journey</b> in the film.</i>
<b>maritime</b>	Bordering on or living or characteristic of those near the sea. <i>A <b>maritime</b> museum.</i>
<b><u>migrate</u></b>	(of an animal, typically a bird or fish) move from one region or habitat to another according to the seasons. <i>Rural populations have <b>migrated</b> to urban areas.</i>
<b>nonnative</b>	Of plants or animals originating in a part of the world other than where they are growing. <i>Our large <b>nonnative</b> population.</i>
<b><u>odyssey</u></b>	A long wandering and eventful journey. <i>His <b>odyssey</b> from military man to politician.</i>

<b>peregrination</b>	Traveling or wandering around. <i>She kept Aunt Ilsa company on her <b>peregrinations</b>.</i>
<b>sightseeing</b>	The activity of visiting places of interest in a particular location. <i>A <b>sightseeing</b> tour.</i>
<b><u>stranger</u></b>	An individual that one is not acquainted with. <i>He must have been a <b>stranger</b> to the village.</i>
<b><u>tour</u></b>	Take a performer production etc on tour. <i>He decided to <b>tour</b> France.</i>
<b>transcontinental</b>	A transcontinental railway or train. <i>A <b>transcontinental</b> radio audience.</i>
<b>travel</b>	Travel upon or across. <i>My job involves a lot of <b>travel</b>.</i>
<b><u>traveler</u></b>	A person who changes location.
<b>trip</b>	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>The man was determined to <b>trip</b> him up on his economics.</i>
<b>venturous</b>	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>A <b>venturous</b> spirit.</i>
<b><u>voyage</u></b>	Go on a voyage. <i>Writing a biography is a <b>voyage</b> of discovery.</i>
<b>world</b>	Another planet like the earth. <i>They consider the church to be independent of the <b>world</b>.</i>
