Definitions of "Weasel" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "weasel" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A stoat.
- A small, slender carnivorous mammal related to, but smaller than, the stoat.
- A person who is regarded as treacherous or sneaky.
- A deceitful or treacherous person.
- Small carnivorous mammal with short legs and elongated body and neck.





Synonyms of "Weasel" as a noun (3 Words)

rogue	A deceitful and unreliable scoundrel. <i>Cenzo you old rogue</i> .
<u>scoundrel</u>	A dishonest or unscrupulous person; a rogue. That scoundrel sets a bad example for the other young men.
wretch	Someone you feel sorry for. <i>Can the poor wretch s corpse tell us anything.</i>
