## Associations of "Weather permitting" (30 Words)

<a href="#">aridity</a>	A deficiency of moisture (especially when resulting from a permanent absence of rainfall).
<a href="#">churn</a>	Produce butter by churning milk or cream. <i>The cream is ripened before it is <b>churned</b>.</i>
<b>climatic</b>	Relating to climate. <i>Under certain <b>climatic</b> conditions desert locusts increase in number.</i>
<b>climatology</b>	The scientific study of climate. <i>The role of clouds is one of the big conundrums of <b>climatology</b>.</i>
<a href="#">cloud</a>	Make overcast or cloudy. <i>Suspicion <b>clouded</b> her face.</i>
<a href="#">cloudy</a>	(of a person’s eyes) misted with tears. <i>The pond water is slightly <b>cloudy</b>.</i>
<b>cyclone</b>	A violent rotating windstorm.
<a href="#">hail</a>	Hail falls. <i>A <b>hail</b> of pebbles.</i>
<a href="#">humid</a>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i><b>Humid</b> weather.</i>
<a href="#">hurricane</a>	A severe tropical cyclone usually with heavy rains and winds moving a 73-136 knots (12 on the Beaufort scale). <i>The manager resigned in a <b>hurricane</b> of disagreement.</i>
<b>inclement</b>	(of weather or climate) severe. <i>The harsh sentence of an <b>inclement</b> judge.</i>
<b>lowering</b>	The act of causing to become less. <i>Society has allowed a <b>lowering</b> of standards.</i>

<b>monsoon</b>	A seasonal prevailing wind in the region of South and SE Asia blowing from the south west between May and September and bringing rain the wet monsoon or from the north east between October and April the dry monsoon.
<b>murky</b>	Dark or gloomy. <i><b>Murky</b> waters.</i>
<b>overcast</b>	Make overcast or cloudy. <i>Fall weather often <b>overcasts</b> our beaches.</i>
<b>precipitation</b>	Overly eager speed (and possible carelessness). <i>The heavy post monsoon <b>precipitations</b>.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Of the sky the clouds etc send down rain. <i>Bombs <b>rained</b> down.</i>
<b>rainfall</b>	The quantity of rain falling within a given area in a given time. <i>The absorption of further supplies from <b>rainfalls</b>.</i>
<b>rainy</b>	(of weather) wet by periods of rain. <i><b>Rainy</b> days.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Make (someone) annoyed or irritated. <i>Winds <b>roil</b> these waters.</i>
<b>seasonal</b>	Occurring at or dependent on a particular season. <i><b>Seasonal</b> rainfall.</i>
<b>snow</b>	A dessert or other dish resembling snow. <i>It s not <b>snowing</b> so heavily now.</i>
<b>squall</b>	Blow in a squall. <i>Low clouds and <b>squalls</b> of driving rain.</i>
<b>storm</b>	Attack by storm attack suddenly. <i>Don t patronize me she <b>stormed</b>.</i>
<b>swirl</b>	Turn in a twisting or spinning motion. <i>She emerged with a <b>swirl</b> of skirts.</i>
<b>tempest</b>	A violent commotion or disturbance. <i>A worldwide <b>tempest</b> of economic recession.</i>
<b>tornado</b>	A person or thing characterized by violent or devastating action or emotion. <i>Teenagers caught up in a <b>tornado</b> of sexual confusion.</i>
<b>vortex</b>	A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides). <i>A swirling <b>vortex</b> of emotions.</i>
<b>whirlpool</b>	A quickly rotating mass of water in a river or sea into which objects may be drawn, typically caused by the meeting of conflicting currents. <i>He was drawing her down into an emotional <b>whirlpool</b>.</i>
