
A measure of length equivalent to a chain 66 ft. The action would initiate a **chain** of events.

<u>conglomeration</u>	A rounded spherical form. A loose <b>conglomeration</b> of pieces.
entanglement	The action or fact of entangling or being entangled. Many dolphins die from <b>entanglement</b> in fishing nets.
knot	A particular method of making a knot. The bird had a <b>knot</b> of feathers forming a crest.
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. Honeysuckle was growing up a <b>lattice</b> round the door.
<u>mass</u>	A body of matter without definite shape. The sun broke out from behind a <b>mass</b> of clouds.
<u>maze</u>	A confusing mass of information. They were trapped in a menacing <b>maze</b> of corridors.
<u>mesh</u>	The act of interlocking or meshing. Cell fragments which agglutinate and form intricate <b>mesh</b> es.
net	A net supported on a cord between two posts to divide the playing area in tennis badminton volleyball etc. <i>The search was delayed allowing the murderers to escape the</i> <b>net</b> .
netting	A trap made of netting to catch fish or birds or insects. Protect crops from pigeons and other birds with <b>netting</b> .
network	A communication system consisting of a group of broadcasting stations that all transmit the same programs. <i>A support network</i> .
nexus	The means of connection between things linked in series. The <b>nexus</b> between industry and political power.
series	(in chronostratigraphy) a range of strata corresponding to an epoch in time, being a subdivision of a system and itself subdivided into stages. <i>The Pliocene series</i> .
set	Any electronic equipment that receives or transmits radio or tv signals. The early <b>set</b> s ran on storage batteries.
snare	A drum fitted with snares a side drum. It was all a <b>snare</b> and delusion.
<u>tangle</u>	A twisted and tangled mass that is highly interwoven. A <b>tangle</b> of golden hair.




<u>trap</u>	A device to hurl clay pigeons into the air for trapshooters. By keeping quiet I was walking into a <b>trap</b> .
vane	Flat surface that rotates and pushes against air or water.

**net** Catch or land a fish or other animal with a net. Customs officials have **net**ted large caches of drugs.



# Associations of "Web" (30 Words)

affiliated	(of a subsidiary group or a person) officially attached or connected to an organization. <i>Affiliated</i> union members.
arachnid	Relating to or denoting arachnids.
<u>channel</u>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. A solid block of metal that is machined to create <b>channel</b> s into which screw in cartridge valves can be installed.
<u>closely</u>	In a careful and attentive way. <i>Closely</i> spaced homes.
connected	Stored in, controlled by, or in direct communication with a central computer. A <b>connected</b> series of cargo holds.



connection	(usually plural) a person who is influential and to whom you are connected in some way (as by family or friendship. <i>Ferry connections are sporadic in the low season.</i>
<u>correlated</u>	Mutually related.
correlative	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. The child s right to education is a <b>correlative</b> of the parent s duty to send the child to school.
corresponding	Analogous or equivalent in character, form, or function; comparable. All rights carry with them <b>corresponding</b> responsibilities.
<u>dive</u>	Plunge head first into water with one's arms raised over one's head. <b>Dive</b> rs should have a good intake of fluid before each <b>dive</b> .
enmesh	Involve (someone) in a difficult situation from which it is hard to escape. <i>He is <b>enmesh</b>ed in an adulterous affair.</i>
gossamer	A fine, filmy substance consisting of cobwebs spun by small spiders, seen especially in autumn. A fine <b>gossamer</b> fabric that clung to her skin.
inextricable	Impossible to disentangle or separate. <i>Inextricable unity</i> .
interconnect	Be interwoven or interconnected. The lakes are <b>interconnect</b> ed by trails filled with joggers.
interface	Connect with another computer or piece of equipment by an interface. The <b>interface</b> between chemistry and biology.
interlinear	Written or printed between the lines of a text. A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.
interlock	The act of interlocking or meshing. A dress in soft <b>interlock</b> .
<u>internet</u>	A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange. <i>Internet</i> access.
linked	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<u>mesh</u>	The act of interlocking or meshing. Finer wire <b>mesh</b> es are used for smaller particles.
net	A goal lined with netting as in soccer or hockey. This sale <b>net</b> ted me 1 million.
network	Connect as or operate with a network. You have to <b>network</b> if you want to get a good job.



online	With processing of computer data carried out simultaneously with its production. The new power plant will go <b>online</b> this month.
<u>relatively</u>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>The site was cheap and <b>relatively</b> clean.</i>
scorpion	Used in names of arachnids and insects resembling a scorpion e g false scorpion water scorpion.
<u>spider</u>	Form a pattern suggestive of a spider or its web. A system of tunnels <b>spider</b> through the district.
surfing	The sport or pastime of riding a wave towards the shore while standing or lying on a surfboard. Why share your internet connection with people <b>surfing</b> and chatting.
<u>swim</u>	The act of swimming. He landed two 5 lb chub from the same <b>swim</b> .
<u>tangle</u>	Tangle or complicate. The broom somehow got <b>tangle</b> d up in my long skirt.
tarantula	Large hairy tropical spider with fangs that can inflict painful but not highly venomous bites.
