- *An intricate network suggesting something that was formed by weaving or interweaving.*
- *The World Wide Web or the internet.*
- *The endless wire mesh in a papermaking machine on which the paper is made.*
- *A fabric (especially a fabric in the process of being woven).*
- *An intricate trap that entangles or ensnares its victim.*
- *Membrane connecting the toes of some aquatic birds and mammals.*
- *A roll of paper used in a continuous printing process.*
- *A complex system of interconnected elements.*
- *Computer network consisting of a collection of internet sites that offer text and graphics and sound and animation resources through the hypertext transfer protocol.*

- *A membrane between the toes of a swimming bird or other aquatic animal.*
- *A filmy network spun by some insect larvae, especially communal caterpillars.*
- *A piece of woven fabric.*
- *A network of fine threads constructed by a spider from fluid secreted by its spinnerets, used to catch its prey.*

### chain

A measure of length equivalent to a chain 66 ft.  
*The action would initiate a **chain** of events.*

<b>complex</b>	(psychoanalysis) a combination of emotions and impulses that have been rejected from awareness but still influence a person's behavior. <i>A <b>complex</b> of hotels.</i>
<b>conglomeration</b>	A rounded spherical form. <i>A loose <b>conglomeration</b> of pieces.</i>
<b>entanglement</b>	The action or fact of entangling or being entangled. <i>Many dolphins die from <b>entanglement</b> in fishing nets.</i>
<b>knot</b>	A particular method of making a knot. <i>The bird had a <b>knot</b> of feathers forming a crest.</i>
<b>lattice</b>	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>Honeysuckle was growing up a <b>lattice</b> round the door.</i>
<b>mass</b>	A body of matter without definite shape. <i>The sun broke out from behind a <b>mass</b> of clouds.</i>
<b>maze</b>	A confusing mass of information. <i>They were trapped in a menacing <b>maze</b> of corridors.</i>
<b>mesh</b>	The act of interlocking or meshing. <i>Cell fragments which agglutinate and form intricate <b>meshes</b>.</i>
<b>net</b>	A net supported on a cord between two posts to divide the playing area in tennis badminton volleyball etc. <i>The search was delayed allowing the murderers to escape the <b>net</b>.</i>
<b>netting</b>	A trap made of netting to catch fish or birds or insects. <i>Protect crops from pigeons and other birds with <b>netting</b>.</i>
<b>network</b>	A communication system consisting of a group of broadcasting stations that all transmit the same programs. <i>A support <b>network</b>.</i>
<b>nexus</b>	The means of connection between things linked in series. <i>The <b>nexus</b> between industry and political power.</i>
<b>series</b>	(in chronostratigraphy) a range of strata corresponding to an epoch in time, being a subdivision of a system and itself subdivided into stages. <i>The Pliocene <b>series</b>.</i>
<b>set</b>	Any electronic equipment that receives or transmits radio or tv signals. <i>The early <b>sets</b> ran on storage batteries.</i>
<b>snare</b>	A drum fitted with snares a side drum. <i>It was all a <b>snare</b> and delusion.</i>
<b>tangle</b>	A twisted and tangled mass that is highly interwoven. <i>A <b>tangle</b> of golden hair.</i>



**trap**

A device to hurl clay pigeons into the air for trapshooters.  
*By keeping quiet I was walking into a **trap**.*

**vane**

Flat surface that rotates and pushes against air or water.

**world wide web** All of the living human inhabitants of the earth.

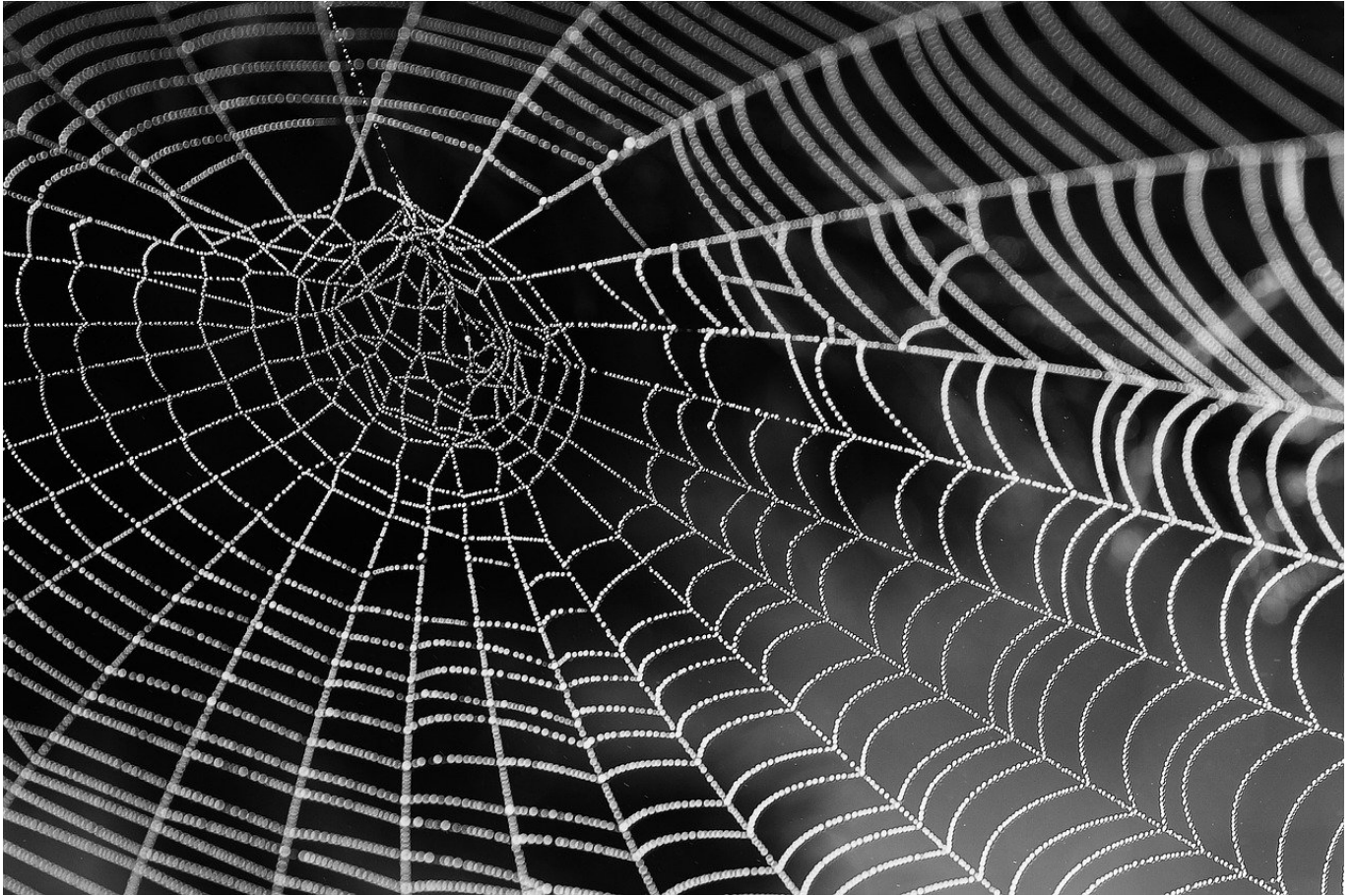
**www**

## Synonyms of "Web" as a verb (1 Word)

**net** Catch or land a fish or other animal with a net.  
*Customs officials have **netted** large caches of drugs.*



## Usage Examples of "Web" as a verb

- *She noticed his tanned skin, webbed with fine creases.*





## Associations of "Web" (30 Words)

- affiliated** (of a subsidiary group or a person) officially attached or connected to an organization.  
***Affiliated*** union members.
- arachnid** Relating to or denoting arachnids.
- channel** A service or station using a channel of frequencies.  
*A solid block of metal that is machined to create **channels** into which screw in cartridge valves can be installed.*
- closely** In a careful and attentive way.  
***Closely*** spaced homes.
- connected** Stored in, controlled by, or in direct communication with a central computer.  
*A **connected** series of cargo holds.*



<b>connection</b>	(usually plural) a person who is influential and to whom you are connected in some way (as by family or friendship). <i>Ferry <b>connections</b> are sporadic in the low season.</i>
<b>correlated</b>	Mutually related.
<b>correlative</b>	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>The child's right to education is a <b>correlative</b> of the parent's duty to send the child to school.</i>
<b>corresponding</b>	Analogous or equivalent in character, form, or function; comparable. <i>All rights carry with them <b>corresponding</b> responsibilities.</i>
<b>dive</b>	Plunge head first into water with one's arms raised over one's head. <i><b>Divers</b> should have a good intake of fluid before each <b>dive</b>.</i>
<b>enmesh</b>	Involve (someone) in a difficult situation from which it is hard to escape. <i>He is <b>enmeshed</b> in an adulterous affair.</i>
<b>gossamer</b>	A fine, filmy substance consisting of cobwebs spun by small spiders, seen especially in autumn. <i>A fine <b>gossamer</b> fabric that clung to her skin.</i>
<b>inextricable</b>	Impossible to disentangle or separate. <i><b>Inextricable</b> unity.</i>
<b>interconnect</b>	Be interwoven or interconnected. <i>The lakes are <b>interconnected</b> by trails filled with joggers.</i>
<b>interface</b>	Connect with another computer or piece of equipment by an interface. <i>The <b>interface</b> between chemistry and biology.</i>
<b>interlinear</b>	Written or printed between the lines of a text. <i>A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.</i>
<b>interlock</b>	The act of interlocking or meshing. <i>A dress in soft <b>interlock</b>.</i>
<b>internet</b>	A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange. <i><b>Internet</b> access.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>mesh</b>	The act of interlocking or meshing. <i>Finer wire <b>meshes</b> are used for smaller particles.</i>
<b>net</b>	A goal lined with netting as in soccer or hockey. <i>This sale <b>netted</b> me 1 million.</i>
<b>network</b>	Connect as or operate with a network. <i>You have to <b>network</b> if you want to get a good job.</i>

<b>online</b>	With processing of computer data carried out simultaneously with its production. <i>The new power plant will go <b>online</b> this month.</i>
<b><u>relatively</u></b>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>The site was cheap and <b>relatively</b> clean.</i>
<b>scorpion</b>	Used in names of arachnids and insects resembling a scorpion e.g false scorpion water scorpion.
<b><u>spider</u></b>	Form a pattern suggestive of a spider or its web. <i>A system of tunnels <b>spider</b> through the district.</i>
<b>surfing</b>	The sport or pastime of riding a wave towards the shore while standing or lying on a surfboard. <i>Why share your internet connection with people <b>surfing</b> and chatting.</i>
<b><u>swim</u></b>	The act of swimming. <i>He landed two 5 lb chub from the same <b>swim</b>.</i>
<b><u>tangle</u></b>	Tangle or complicate. <i>The broom somehow got <b>tangled</b> up in my long skirt.</i>
<b>tarantula</b>	Large hairy tropical spider with fangs that can inflict painful but not highly venomous bites.
