Weekly as an Adjective

Definitions of "Weekly" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “weekly” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Relating to or calculated in terms of a week.*
- *Of or occurring every seven days.*
- *Done, produced, or occurring once a week.*



Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adjective (3 Words)

- hebdomadal** Of or occurring every seven days.
*Oxford University's **Hebdomadal** Council.*
- hebdomadary** Of or occurring every seven days.
- seven-day** Lasting through a week.



Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adjective

- *The difference in weekly income is £29.10.*
- *Weekly paper.*
- *A weekly visit.*
- *There was a weekly dance on Wednesdays.*



Weekly as an Adverb

Definitions of "Weekly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "weekly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without missing a week.*
- *Once a week.*



Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adverb (4 Words)

each week	To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).
hebdomadally	Without missing a week.
on a weekly basis	Without missing a week.
once a week	On one occasion.



Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adverb

- *She visited her aunt weekly.*
- *Interviews were given weekly.*



Associations of "Weekly" (30 Words)

- almanac** An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
- anniversary** The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.
*The 50th **anniversary** of the Battle of Britain.*
- annual** An annual plant.
*Sow **annuals** in spring.*
- annually** Once a year; every year.
*They travel to China **annually**.*
- biannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.
*The **biannual** meeting of the planning committee.*
- biennial** A biennial plant.
*Parsnips and carrots are **biennial** plants often grown as annuals.*

bimonthly	A periodical produced twice a month or every two months. A bimonthly newsletter.
biweekly	Done, produced, or occurring every two weeks or twice a week. <i>She followed her doctor s instructions to undergo health checks biweekly.</i>
<u>calendar</u>	Enter something in a calendar or timetable. <i>It was at their discretion whether to index or calendar the records.</i>
cyclical	Recurring in cycles. <i>The cyclical nature of the cement industry.</i>
<u>daily</u>	A newspaper published every day except Sunday. A daily newspaper.
day-to-day	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.
diurnal	(of flowers) open only during the day. Diurnal aberration.
<u>every</u>	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. Every party is welcome.
monthly	Once a month; every month. <i>Most of us get paid monthly.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>We often met over a cup of coffee.</i>
<u>perennial</u>	A perennial plant. Perennial manifestations of urban crisis.
perennially	On a yearly basis for several years. <i>A lily that grows perennially from bulbs.</i>
<u>periodic</u>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The periodic appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
periodical	(of a magazine or newspaper) published at regular intervals. <i>Britain s best periodical art magazine.</i>
<u>publication</u>	The act of issuing printed materials. <i>Scientific publications.</i>
quarterly	In diagonally opposed quarters of an escutcheon. <i>Interest is paid quarterly.</i>
regular	Relating to a person who does something regularly. Regular duties.
<u>regularly</u>	In a regular way without variation. <i>Leaves arranged regularly along the stem.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.

The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event.

tercentenary *The conference celebrates the **tercentenary** of the Scottish architect William Adam.*

triennial *A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

twice *To double the degree. The tablets should be taken **twice** a day.*

year *A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars. A school **year**.*

yearly *Without missing a year. **Yearly** medical examinations.*
