Definitions of "Weekly" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “weekly” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Relating to or calculated in terms of a week.*
- *Of or occurring every seven days.*
- *Done, produced, or occurring once a week.*



Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adjective (3 Words)

hebdomadal Of or occurring every seven days.
*Oxford University's **Hebdomadal** Council.*

hebdomadary Of or occurring every seven days.

seven-day Lasting through a week.



Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adjective

- *The difference in weekly income is £29.10.*
- *Weekly paper.*
- *A weekly visit.*
- *There was a weekly dance on Wednesdays.*



Weekly as an Adverb

Definitions of "Weekly" as an adverb

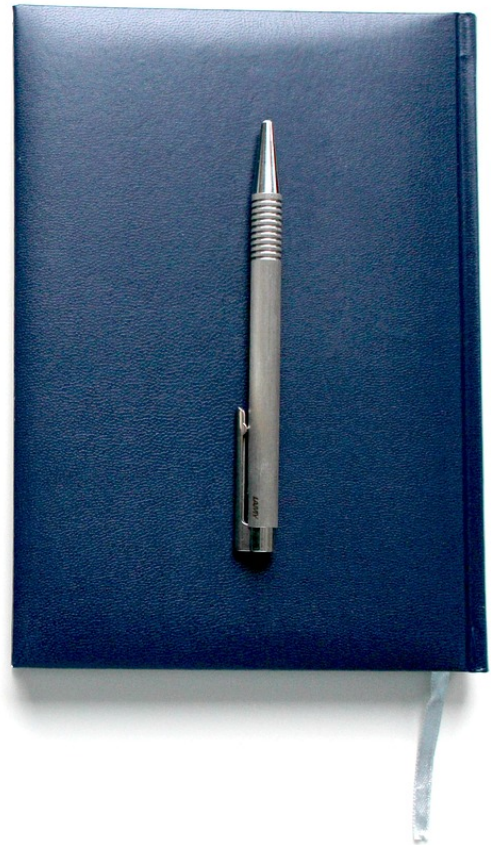
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "weekly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without missing a week.*
- *Once a week.*



Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adverb (4 Words)

each week	To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).
hebdomadally	Without missing a week.
on a weekly basis	Without missing a week.
once a week	On one occasion.



Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adverb

- *She visited her aunt weekly.*
- *Interviews were given weekly.*



Associations of "Weekly" (30 Words)

almanac	An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
<u>anniversary</u>	The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year. <i>The 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.</i>
<u>annual</u>	An annual plant. <i>Sow annuals in spring.</i>
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
<u>biannual</u>	Occurring or payable twice each year. <i>The biannual meeting of the planning committee.</i>
biennial	A biennial plant. <i>Parsnips and carrots are biennial plants often grown as annuals.</i>

bimonthly	A periodical produced twice a month or every two months. A bimonthly newsletter.
biweekly	Done, produced, or occurring every two weeks or twice a week. She followed her doctor's instructions to undergo health checks biweekly .
<u>calendar</u>	Enter something in a calendar or timetable. It was at their discretion whether to index or calendar the records.
cyclical	Recurring in cycles. The cyclical nature of the cement industry.
<u>daily</u>	A newspaper published every day except Sunday. A daily newspaper.
day-to-day	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.
diurnal	(of flowers) open only during the day. Diurnal aberration.
<u>every</u>	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. Every party is welcome.
monthly	Once a month; every month. Most of us get paid monthly .
oft	Many times at short intervals. We often met over a cup of coffee.
<u>perennial</u>	A perennial plant. Perennial manifestations of urban crisis.
perennially	On a yearly basis for several years. A lily that grows perennially from bulbs.
<u>periodic</u>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. The periodic appearance of the seventeen year locust.
periodical	(of a magazine or newspaper) published at regular intervals. Britain's best periodical art magazine.
<u>publication</u>	The act of issuing printed materials. Scientific publications .
quarterly	In diagonally opposed quarters of an escutcheon. Interest is paid quarterly .
regular	Relating to a person who does something regularly. Regular duties.
<u>regularly</u>	In a regular way without variation. Leaves arranged regularly along the stem.
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.

The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event.

tercentenary *The conference celebrates the **tercentenary** of the Scottish architect William Adam.*

triennial *A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years.
The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

twice *To double the degree.
The tablets should be taken **twice** a day.*

year *A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars.
A school **year**.*

yearly *Without missing a year.
Yearly medical examinations.*
