## **Weekly as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Weekly" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “weekly” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Relating to or calculated in terms of a week.*
- *Of or occurring every seven days.*
- *Done, produced, or occurring once a week.*



## Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adjective (3 Words)

- hebdomadal** Of or occurring every seven days.  
*Oxford University's **Hebdomadal** Council.*
- hebdomadary** Of or occurring every seven days.
- seven-day** Lasting through a week.



## Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adjective

- *Weekly paper.*
- *A weekly visit.*
- *There was a weekly dance on Wednesdays.*



## Weekly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Weekly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "weekly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

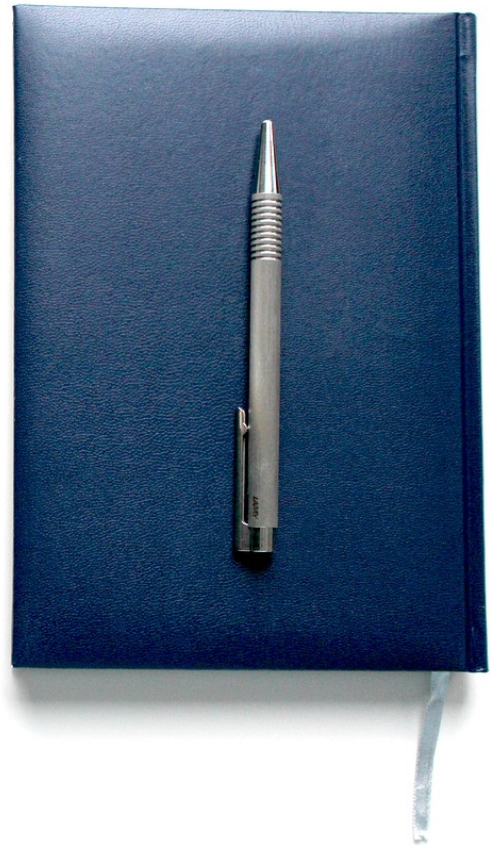
- *Without missing a week.*
- *Once a week.*





### **Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adverb (4 Words)**

<b>each week</b>	To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).
<b>hebdomadally</b>	Without missing a week.
<b>on a weekly basis</b>	Without missing a week.
<b>once a week</b>	On one occasion.



## Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adverb

- *She visited her aunt weekly.*
- *Interviews were given weekly.*



## Associations of "Weekly" (30 Words)

- almanac** An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
- anniversary** The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.  
*The 50th **anniversary** of the Battle of Britain.*
- annual** An annual plant.  
*Sow **annuals** in spring.*
- annually** Once a year; every year.  
*They travel to China **annually**.*
- biannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.  
*The **biannual** meeting of the planning committee.*
- biennial** A biennial plant.  
*Parsnips and carrots are **biennial** plants often grown as annuals.*

<b>bimonthly</b>	A periodical produced twice a month or every two months. A <b>bimonthly</b> newsletter.
<b>biweekly</b>	Done, produced, or occurring every two weeks or twice a week. <i>She followed her doctor s instructions to undergo health checks <b>biweekly</b>.</i>
<u>calendar</u>	Enter something in a calendar or timetable. <i>It was at their discretion whether to index or <b>calendar</b> the records.</i>
<b>cyclical</b>	Recurring in cycles. <i>The <b>cyclical</b> nature of the cement industry.</i>
<u>daily</u>	A newspaper published every day except Sunday. A <b>daily</b> newspaper.
<b>day-to-day</b>	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.
<b>diurnal</b>	(of flowers) open only during the day. <b>Diurnal</b> aberration.
<u>every</u>	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <b>Every</b> party is welcome.
<b>monthly</b>	Once a month; every month. <i>Most of us get paid <b>monthly</b>.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>We <b>often</b> met over a cup of coffee.</i>
<u>perennial</u>	A perennial plant. <b>Perennial</b> manifestations of urban crisis.
<b>perennially</b>	On a yearly basis for several years. <i>A lily that grows <b>perennially</b> from bulbs.</i>
<u>periodic</u>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
<b>periodical</b>	(of a magazine or newspaper) published at regular intervals. <i>Britain s best <b>periodical</b> art magazine.</i>
<u>publication</u>	The act of issuing printed materials. <i>Scientific <b>publications</b>.</i>
<b>quarterly</b>	In diagonally opposed quarters of an escutcheon. <i>Interest is paid <b>quarterly</b>.</i>
<b>regular</b>	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <b>Regular</b> duties.
<u>regularly</u>	In a regular way without variation. <i>Leaves arranged <b>regularly</b> along the stem.</i>
<b>semiannual</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year.



The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event.

**tercentenary** *The conference celebrates the **tercentenary** of the Scottish architect William Adam.*

**triennial** *A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

**twice** *To double the degree. The tablets should be taken **twice** a day.*

**year** *A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars. A school **year**.*

**yearly** *Without missing a year. **Yearly** medical examinations.*
