hebdomadary Of or occurring every seven days.

seven-day Lasting through a week.

Definitions of "Weekly" as an adverb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "weekly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- Without missing a week.
- Once a week.






Synonyms of "Weekly" as an adverb (4 Words)

each week To or from every one of two or more (considered individually.

hebdomadally Without missing a week.on a weekly basis Without missing a week.

once a week On one occasion.





Usage Examples of "Weekly" as an adverb

- She visited her aunt weekly.
- Interviews were given weekly.

almanac An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or

fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.

The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a

anniversary previous year.

The 50th **anniversary** of the Battle of Britain.

annual An annual plant.

annually Once a year; every year.

They travel to China annually.

Occurring or payable twice each year.

biannual

The biannual meeting of the planning committee.

biennial A biennial plant.

Parsnips and carrots are **biennial** plants often grown as annuals.



bimonthly A periodical produced twice a month or every two months.

A bimonthly newsletter.

biweekly Done, produced, or occurring every two weeks or twice a week.

She followed her doctor s instructions to undergo health checks biweekly.

calendar Enter something in a calendar or timetable.

It was at their discretion whether to index or **calendar** the records.

cyclical Recurring in cycles.

The **cyclical** nature of the cement industry.

daily

A newspaper published every day except Sunday.

A **daily** newspaper.

day-to-day The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.

diurnal (of flowers) open only during the day.

Diurnal aberration.

Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without

every exception.

quarterly

Every party is welcome.

monthly Once a month; every month.

Most of us get paid **monthly**.

oft Many times at short intervals.

We **oft**en met over a cup of coffee.

A perennial plant.

perennial Perennial manifestations of urban crisis.

on a yearly basis for several years.

A lily that grows **perennially** from bulbs.

Relating to the periodic table of the elements.
