gasp	Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>Jeremy gasped out an apology.</i>
gram	A metric unit of mass equal to one thousandth of a kilogram.
grandmother	The mother of one’s father or mother. <i>My grandmother is ill.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>Steering that is heavy when parking.</i>

inch	As a unit of map scale so many inches representing one mile on the ground. <i>Spain s conservatives are inching ahead.</i>
keystone	A central stone at the summit of an arch, locking the whole together. <i>Cooperation remains the keystone of the government s security policy.</i>
liter	A metric unit of capacity, formerly defined as the volume of one kilogram of pure water under standard conditions; now equal to 1,000 cubic centimeters (or approximately 1.75 pints).
load	Fill or place a load on. <i>The streams deposited their loads leaving thin sheets of gravel or sand.</i>
meter	Stamp with a meter indicating the postage. <i>Meter the flow of water.</i>
metric	The metric system. <i>All measurements are given in metric form.</i>
onus	Something that is one's duty or responsibility. <i>The onus is on you to show that you have suffered loss.</i>
ounce	A very small amount of something. <i>Melt three ounces of butter in a large frying pan.</i>
palpitate	Cause to throb or beat rapidly. <i>His heart palpitated.</i>
pant	Utter while panting as if out of breath. <i>The opening song makes you pant for more.</i>
penny	(in biblical use) a denarius. <i>We didn t get paid a penny.</i>
ponderable	Capable of being thought about. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
pound	Place or shut up in a pound. <i>The locks pound the water of the canal.</i>
ream	Enlarge with a reamer. <i>Ream a hole.</i>
sterling	British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK. <i>Prices in sterling are shown.</i>
ton	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>He scored 102 not out his third ton of the tour.</i>
