bale	Make into a bale. <i>The fire destroyed 500 bales of hay.</i>
brood	Be in a huff and display one’s displeasure. <i>A brood of chicks.</i>
burden	A load, typically a heavy one. <i>The burden of responsibility.</i>
centimeter	A metric unit of length equal to one hundredth of a meter.
consider	Give careful consideration to. <i>Each application is considered on its merits.</i>
considerable	(of a person) having merit or distinction. <i>Went to considerable trouble for us.</i>
encumber	Restrict or impede (someone or something) in such a way that free action or movement is difficult. <i>They had arrived encumbered with families.</i>
flock	Come together as in a cluster or flock. <i>Tourists flock to Oxford in their thousands.</i>
gasp	Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>Jeremy gasped out an apology.</i>
gram	A metric unit of mass equal to one thousandth of a kilogram.
grandmother	The mother of one’s father or mother. <i>My grandmother is ill.</i>
heavy	A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind. <i>Heavy hydrogen.</i>
inch	As a unit of rainfall a quantity that would cover a horizontal surface to a depth of one inch equivalent to 253 7 cubic metres per hectare. <i>More than four inches of rain is expected.</i>

liter	A metric unit of capacity, formerly defined as the volume of one kilogram of pure water under standard conditions; now equal to 1,000 cubic centimeters (or approximately 1.75 pints).
load	Of a ship or vehicle take on a load. <i>Load your camera before you start.</i>
lot	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>They drew lots for it.</i>
meter	Measure with a meter. <i>Meter the flow of water.</i>
metric	Relating to or denoting a metric. <i>The metric system.</i>
onus	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>The onus is on you to show that you have suffered loss.</i>
ounce	A unit of weight equal to one sixteenth of a pound or 16 drams or 28.349 grams. <i>Robyn summoned up every ounce of strength.</i>
<u>outweigh</u>	Be heavier, greater, or more significant than. <i>These considerations outweigh our wishes.</i>
pant	Run or go in a specified direction while panting. <i>He was panting when he reached the top.</i>
penny	Used for emphasis to denote no money at all. <i>We didn't get paid a penny.</i>
pile	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>My students piled out of three cars.</i>
ponderable	Capable of being thought about. <i>Something ponderable from the outer world something of which we can say that its weight is so and so.</i>
<u>pound</u>	A nontechnical unit of force equal to the mass of 1 pound with an acceleration of free fall equal to 32 feet sec sec. <i>The prisoners are safely pounded.</i>
ream	Squeeze the juice out of a fruit with a reamer. <i>The dentist reamed out the debris in the course of the root canal treatment.</i>
ton	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>All of a sudden I had tons of friends.</i>
<u>unit</u>	The smallest measure of investment in a unit trust. <i>The intensive care unit.</i>
