<b>aloha</b>	An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>What a great way to spread the <b>aloha</b>.</i>
<b>bye</b>	One or more holes remaining unplayed after a match has been decided. <i>They said their good <b>byes</b>.</i>
<b>caller</b>	The bettor in a card game who matches the bet and calls for a show of hands. <i>An experienced <b>caller</b> from the commentary team.</i>
<b>cheerfully</b>	In a cheerful way. <i>He <b>cheerfully</b> admits to being the wrong side of fifty.</i>
<b>client</b>	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>Workstation <b>clients</b> are going to be easy to install.</i>
<b>cordially</b>	In a warm and friendly way. <i>He was greeted <b>cordially</b> by the archbishop.</i>
<b>courteously</b>	In a polite manner.
<b>curtsy</b>	Perform a curtsy. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>customer</b>	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>Mr Harrison was a regular <b>customer</b> at the Golden Lion.</i>
<b>goodbye</b>	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our <b>goodbyes</b> and set off.</i>
<b><a href="#">greet</a></b>	Send greetings to. <i>Some of the customers <b>greeted</b> the barman in Gaelic.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>Mandy shouted a <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">guest</a></b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A <b>guest</b> speaker.</i>
<b>handshake</b>	An act of shaking a person’s hand with one’s own as a greeting.

<b><u>happily</u></b>	In a joyous manner. <i>Eleanor giggled <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b><u>hello</u></b>	Say or shout hello. <i>I pressed the phone button and <b>helloed</b>.</i>
<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b><u>hospitable</u></b>	Having an open mind. <i>A good natured and <b>hospitable</b> man.</i>
<b>hospitality</b>	The friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. <i>The BBC s <b>hospitality</b> suite.</i>
<b><u>host</u></b>	Be the host of or for. <i>Atlanta was chosen to be <b>host</b> for the Olympic Games.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b>married</b>	A person who is married. <i>We were young <b>marrieds</b> during World War Two.</i>
<b><u>pledge</u></b>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>He had given the object as a <b>pledge</b> to a creditor.</i>
<b>politely</b>	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>The policeman answered <b>politely</b> Now look here lady.</i>
<b>reception</b>	A formal party of people; as after a wedding. <i>The tight end made a great <b>reception</b> on the 20 yard line.</i>
<b><u>receptive</u></b>	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i><b>Receptive</b> to reason and the logic of facts.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Acknowledge the existence, validity, or legality of. <i>Julia hardly <b>recognized</b> Jill when they met.</i>
<b>salutation</b>	An acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>We greeted them but no one returned our <b>salutations</b>.</i>
<b>salute</b>	Make a formal salute to. <i>He acknowledged the <b>salute</b> of the policeman on duty.</i>
<b><u>welcoming</u></b>	Very cordial. <i>A <b>welcoming</b> smile.</i>
