| aloha | An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>From the first aloha everyone is friendly and attentive.</i> |
| applause | Approval or praise expressed by clapping. <i>They gave him a round of applause.</i> |
| bye | You advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>They said their good byes.</i> |
| caller | An investor who buys a call option. <i>The bailiff was a frequent caller.</i> |
| cheerfully | In a cheerful manner. <i>He was whistling cheerfully.</i> |
| client | (in ancient Rome) a plebeian under the protection of a patrician. <i>A client referred for counselling.</i> |
| cordially | In a warm and friendly way. <i>He was greeted cordially by the archbishop.</i> |
| courteously | In a polite manner. |
| curtsy | Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a curtsy to him.</i> |
| friendly | Kind and pleasant. <i>We want friendly relations with all countries.</i> |
| goodbye | An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our goodbyes and set off.</i> |
| greet | Send greetings to. <i>Sam threw open the door and was greeted by a cacophony of noise.</i> |
| greeting | A formal expression of goodwill, said on meeting or in a written message. <i>Mandy shouted a greeting.</i> |
| handshake | An act of shaking a person’s hand with one’s own as a greeting. |

| <u>happily</u> | It is fortunate that. <i>They shouted happily.</i> |
| <u>hello</u> | An utterance of hello a greeting. <i>I pressed the phone button and helloed.</i> |
| hi | An expression of greeting. |
| <u>hospitable</u> | Disposed to treat guests and strangers with cordiality and generosity. Hospitable invitations. |
| hospitality | Relating to or denoting the business of entertaining clients, conference delegates, or other official visitors. <i>The BBC s hospitality suite.</i> |
| <u>host</u> | A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>Innsbruck once played host to the Winter Olympics.</i> |
| kissing | Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs. |
| oh | A midwestern state in north central United States in the Great Lakes region. |
| politely | In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>He waited politely for me to ask questions.</i> |
| <u>receptive</u> | Able to receive signals or stimuli. <i>Only the dominant male would have had access to the receptive female.</i> |
| salutation | (usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>We would not expect a love letter to include a formal address and salutation.</i> |
| salute | Make a formal salute to. <i>A twenty one gun salute.</i> |
| warm | Get warm or warmer. <i>A warm debate.</i> |
| welcome | Bid welcome to greet upon arrival. <i>I m pleased to see you lad you re welcome.</i> |
| yeah | Not only so, but. |
| <u>yes</u> | An affirmative. <i>Answering with assured and ardent yeses.</i> |
