## Associations of "Well established" (30 Words)

<b>assured</b>	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>An extremely <b>assured</b> performance.</i>
<a href="#"><u>certain</u></a>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. <i>He faced <b>certain</b> death.</i>
<a href="#"><u>certainly</u></a>	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b>certitude</b>	Absolute certainty or conviction that something is the case. <i>The question may never be answered with <b>certitude</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>clarity</u></a>	The quality of being easy to see or hear; sharpness of image or sound. <i>For the sake of <b>clarity</b> each of these strategies is dealt with separately.</i>
<b>conciseness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>convinced</b>	Having a strong belief or conviction. <i>She was not entirely <b>convinced</b> of the soundness of his motives.</i>
<b>decided</b>	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very <b>decided</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>definite</u></a>	Clearly true or real; unambiguous. <i>Organizations have boundaries in the sense that they may occupy a <b>definite</b> geographical area.</i>
<b>dependable</b>	Trustworthy and reliable. <i>A <b>dependable</b> worker.</i>
<b>entrench</b>	Occupy a trench or secured area. <i>By 1947 de Gaulle's political opponents were firmly <b>entrenched</b> in power.</i>
<a href="#"><u>entrenched</u></a>	Established firmly and securely. <i>The <b>entrenched</b> power of the nobility.</i>

<b>fasten</b>	Become fixed or fastened. <i><b>Fasten</b> the lock onto the door.</i>
<b><u>firmly</u></b>	In a secure manner; in a manner free from danger. <i>The door remained <b>firmly</b> shut.</i>
<b><u>fortified</u></b>	Denoting wine of a type to which spirits have been added so as to produce port, sherry, or a similar drink. <i>Many <b>fortified</b> wines are sweet.</i>
<b>incontestable</b>	Not able to be disputed.
<b>ordained</b>	Invested with ministerial or priestly functions. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<b><u>proven</u></b>	(of a new method, system, or treatment) tried and tested. <i>A system based on <b>proven</b> technologies.</i>
<b>securely</b>	In a confident and unselfconscious manner. <i>She held the child <b>securely</b>.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Established or decided beyond dispute or doubt. <i>I don't feel entirely <b>settled</b> here.</i>
<b>simple</b>	Lacking mental capacity and subtlety. <i><b>Simple</b> mechanisms.</i>
<b>simplicity</b>	The quality or condition of being plain or uncomplicated in form or design. <i>The grandeur and <b>simplicity</b> of Roman architecture.</i>
<b>simplification</b>	The act of reducing complexity. <i>He is proposing <b>simplification</b> of the planning system.</i>
<b>solidly</b>	In a sound or consistent manner but without any special qualities or flair. <i>The company had performed <b>solidly</b> in difficult times.</i>
<b>stoutly</b>	In a resolute manner. <i>The houses are built <b>stoutly</b> of granite.</i>
<b><u>straightforward</u></b>	Without evasion or compromise. <i>In a <b>straightforward</b> case no fees will be charged.</i>
<b>strongly</b>	In a way that is able to withstand force or wear. <i>The rebel movement <b>strongly</b> denied responsibility for the attack.</i>
<b><u>tested</u></b>	Tested and proved useful or correct. <i>A <b>tested</b> method.</i>
