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Associations of "Well received" (30 Words)

accept	Make use of or accept for some purpose. <i>They accepted the need to cut overheads.</i>
<u>accessible</u>	(of a person, especially one in a position of authority) friendly and easy to talk to; approachable. <i>Most students now have computers accessible.</i>
acquire	Locate (a moving entity) by means of a tracking system such as radar. <i>You must acquire the rudiments of Greek.</i>
achievement	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The achievement of self control.</i>
<u>admit</u>	Admit into a group or community. <i>The theater admits 300 people.</i>
admittedly	As acknowledged. <i>Admittedly the salary was not wonderful.</i>
assured	Characterized by certainty or security. <i>An assured tenancy.</i>
available	Able to be used or obtained; at someone's disposal. <i>Available in many colors.</i>
<u>concede</u>	Be willing to concede. <i>Their rights to redress of grievances were conceded once more.</i>
conveniently	In a convenient manner. <i>The switch was conveniently located.</i>
derive	Reason by deduction; establish by deduction. <i>Words whose spelling derives from Dr Johnson's incorrect etymology.</i>
familiarly	In an intimately familiar manner.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>That air of his always fetches women.</i>

get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>We ll get them.</i>
grantor	A person or institution that makes a grant or conveyance. <i>Conveyed from grantor to grantee.</i>
handy	Ready to hand. <i>Keep credit cards handy.</i>
have	Have put someone at a disadvantage in an argument. <i>Have an assistant.</i>
incur	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. <i>It was an innocuous remark.</i>
obtain	Be valid, applicable, or true. <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain.</i>
obtainable	Able to be obtained. <i>Savings of up to 50 percent are obtainable.</i>
own	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
permission	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. <i>He received permission to go to Brussels.</i>
procure	Get by special effort. <i>He procured extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.</i>
receptiveness	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>This receptiveness is the key feature in oestral behavior enabling natural mating to occur.</i>
recipient	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. <i>The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
resignedly	With resignation and acceptance; in a resigned manner.
safely	In a way that is not likely to cause or lead to harm or injury. <i>All crews have returned safely from their missions.</i>
shuck	Remove the shucks from maize or shellfish. <i>She shucked off her nightdress and started dressing.</i>
simplicity	Absence of affectation or pretense. <i>They took advantage of her simplicity.</i>
