conveniently	In a convenient manner. The switch was conveniently located.
derive	Reason by deduction; establish by deduction. Words whose spelling derive s from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.
familiarly	In an intimately familiar manner.
fetch	The action of fetching. That air of his always fetch es women.



get	Take vengeance on or get even. We ll get them.
grantor	A person or institution that makes a grant or conveyance. Conveyed from grantor to grantee.
<u>handy</u>	Ready to hand. <i>Keep credit cards handy.</i>
have	Have put someone at a disadvantage in an argument. <i>Have</i> an assistant.
<u>incur</u>	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. I will pay any expenses incur red.
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. It was an innocuous remark.
obtain	Be valid, applicable, or true. Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain .
obtainable	Able to be obtained. Savings of up to 50 percent are obtainable .
<u>own</u>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
permission	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. <i>He received permission</i> to go to Brussels.
procure	Get by special effort. He procure d extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.
receptiveness	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas. <i>This</i> receptiveness <i>is the key feature in oestral behavior enabling natural mating to occur.</i>
recipient	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.
resignedly	With resignation and acceptance; in a resigned manner.
safely	In a way that is not likely to cause or lead to harm or injury. All crews have returned safely from their missions.
shuck	Remove the shucks from maize or shellfish. She shuck ed off her nightdress and started dressing.
simplicity	Absence of affectation or pretense. They took advantage of her simplicity .
