across	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>A crater some 30 metres across.</i>
antipodal	Diametrically opposed to. <i>Antipodal points on a sphere.</i>
astray	Into error or morally questionable behaviour. <i>We went astray but a man redirected us.</i>
athwart	So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>Our words ran athwart and we ended up at cross purposes.</i>
bereavement	The fact or condition of being bereaved. <i>There is no right way to experience bereavement.</i>
beyond	The unknown, especially in references to life after death. <i>Messages from the beyond.</i>
christendom	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>A continuing controversy.</i>
cross	Draw a line or lines across mark with a cross. <i>A crossed cheque.</i>
crossover	Relating to or denoting trials of medical treatment in which experimental subjects and control groups are exchanged after a set period. <i>A jazz classical crossover album.</i>
decamp	Break up or leave a military camp. <i>She persuaded him to decamp.</i>
depart	Be at variance with; be out of line with. <i>He will soon depart his post as high commissioner to Britain.</i>

going	The act of departing. <i>Don't lose track of your child's comings and goings.</i>
horizon	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>It is beyond the horizon of present knowledge.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>An intercontinental flight.</i>
intersect	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude intersect at right angles.</i>
intertwine	Spin, wind, or twist together. <i>Intertwined hearts.</i>
itinerate	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
migrate	Change or cause to change from one system to another. <i>Cells that can form pigment migrate beneath the skin.</i>
migration	The periodic passage of groups of animals (especially birds or fishes) from one region to another for feeding or breeding. <i>There is virtually no cell migration in plants.</i>
move	Move so as to change position perform a nontranslational motion. <i>His family moved the Special Court for adequate maintenance expenses to run the household.</i>
pedestrian	A person who travels by foot. <i>The road is so dangerous pedestrians avoid it.</i>
road	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>The low road of apathy and alienation.</i>
rood	A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>All lines of communication were routed through London.</i>
transverse	Situated or extending across something. <i>From the transverse hall the stairway ascends gracefully.</i>
travel	Travel upon or across. <i>Travel the oceans.</i>
traverse	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if traversed he would be put to prove.</i>
