<a href="#">across</a>	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>A crater some 30 metres <b>across</b>.</i>
antipodal	Diametrically opposed to. <i><b>Antipodal</b> points on a sphere.</i>
<a href="#">astray</a>	Into error or morally questionable behaviour. <i>We went <b>astray</b> but a man redirected us.</i>
athwart	So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>Our words ran <b>athwart</b> and we ended up at cross purposes.</i>
bereavement	The fact or condition of being bereaved. <i>There is no right way to experience <b>bereavement</b>.</i>
<a href="#">beyond</a>	The unknown, especially in references to life after death. <i>Messages from the <b>beyond</b>.</i>
christendom	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>A <b>continuing</b> controversy.</i>
<a href="#">cross</a>	Draw a line or lines across mark with a cross. <i>A <b>crossed</b> cheque.</i>
<a href="#">crossover</a>	Relating to or denoting trials of medical treatment in which experimental subjects and control groups are exchanged after a set period. <i>A jazz classical <b>crossover</b> album.</i>
decamp	Break up or leave a military camp. <i>She persuaded him to <b>decamp</b>.</i>
<a href="#">depart</a>	Be at variance with; be out of line with. <i>He will soon <b>depart</b> his post as high commissioner to Britain.</i>

<b>going</b>	The act of departing. <i>Don't lose track of your child's comings and <b>goings</b>.</i>
<b>horizon</b>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>It is beyond the <b>horizon</b> of present knowledge.</i>
<b>intercontinental</b>	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>An <b>intercontinental</b> flight.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude <b>intersect</b> at right angles.</i>
<b>intertwine</b>	Spin, wind, or twist together. <i><b>Intertwined</b> hearts.</i>
<b>itinerate</b>	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
<b>migrate</b>	Change or cause to change from one system to another. <i>Cells that can form pigment <b>migrate</b> beneath the skin.</i>
<b>migration</b>	The periodic passage of groups of animals (especially birds or fishes) from one region to another for feeding or breeding. <i>There is virtually no cell <b>migration</b> in plants.</i>
<b>move</b>	Move so as to change position perform a nontranslational motion. <i>His family <b>moved</b> the Special Court for adequate maintenance expenses to run the household.</i>
<b>pedestrian</b>	A person who travels by foot. <i>The road is so dangerous <b>pedestrians</b> avoid it.</i>
<b>road</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>The low <b>road</b> of apathy and alienation.</i>
<b>rood</b>	A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>All lines of communication were <b>routed</b> through London.</i>
<b>transverse</b>	Situated or extending across something. <i>From the <b>transverse</b> hall the stairway ascends gracefully.</i>
<b>travel</b>	Travel upon or across. <i><b>Travel</b> the oceans.</i>
<b>traverse</b>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if <b>traversed</b> he would be put to prove.</i>
