| <b>bitterly</b>      | To an extreme, forceful, or particularly harsh degree.<br><i>It was <b>bitterly</b> cold.</i>   |
| <b>complain</b>      | Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness.<br><i>You never listen to me Larry <b>complained</b>.</i>                             |
| <b>cry</b>           | Bring into a particular state by crying.<br><i>Before we had newspapers a town crier would <b>cry</b> the news.</i>                             |
| <b>dirge</b>         | A song or piece of music that is considered too slow, miserable, or boring.<br><i>Singers chanted <b>dirges</b>.</i>                            |
| <b>disappointed</b>  | Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one's hopes or expectations.<br><i>I m <b>disappointed</b> in you Mary.</i> |
| <b>elegy</b>         | (in Greek and Latin verse) a poem written in elegiac couplets, as notably by Catullus and Propertius.   |
| <b>embitter</b>      | Make (someone) feel bitter or resentful.<br><i>He didn t let illness and divorce <b>embitter</b> him.</i>                                       |
| <b>gripe</b>         | Secure a boat with gripes.<br><i>He seized me by the arms with a rude <b>gripe</b>.</i>   |
| <a href="#">howl</a> | Make a howling sound.<br><i>The <b>howl</b> of the wind made him restless.</i>  |
| <b>lachrymal</b>     | A small bone forming part of the eye socket.<br><i>That hysterical then <b>lachrymal</b> then guilt ridden hour.</i>                            |
| <b>lachrymose</b>    | Inducing tears; sad.<br><i>She was pink eyed and <b>lachrymose</b>.</i>   |
| <b>lament</b>        | A mournful poem a lament for the dead.<br><i>He was <b>lamenting</b> the death of his infant daughter.</i>                                      |
| <b>lamentation</b>   | A cry of sorrow and grief.<br><i>Scenes of <b>lamentation</b>.</i>  |

| <b>mourn</b>     | Observe the customs of mourning after the death of a loved one.<br><i>She <b>mourned</b> for her friends who died in the accident.</i>       |
| <b>mourning</b>  | State of sorrow over the death or departure of a loved one.<br><i>If he dies she ll put on <b>mourning</b> but she won t cry.</i>            |
| <b>plaintive</b> | Expressing sorrow.<br><i>A <b>plaintive</b> cry.</i>   |
| <b>resent</b>    | Feel bitter or indignant about.<br><i>She <b>resents</b> being paid less than her co workers.</i>  |
| <b>sad</b>       | Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti.<br><i>Her clothes were in <b>sad</b> shape.</i>   |
| <b>screech</b>   | Make a high pitched screeching noise.<br><i>He ducked at the <b>screechings</b> of shells.</i>   |
| <b>sniffle</b>   | The act of breathing heavily through the nose (as when the nose is congested).<br><i>He was restraining his <b>sniffles</b> rather well.</i> |
| <b>snivel</b>    | An act or sound of snivelling.<br><i>Kate started to <b>snivel</b> looking sad and stunned.</i>  |
| <b>sob</b>       | An act or sound of sobbing.<br><i>He broke down and <b>sobbed</b> like a child.</i>  |
| <b>sorrow</b>    | An event or circumstance that causes sorrow.<br><i>A bereaved person needs time to work through their <b>sorrow</b>.</i>                     |
| <b>squawk</b>    | The noise of squawking.<br><i>Her plan provoked a loud <b>squawk</b> from her friends.</i>   |
| <b>squeal</b>    | Make a squeal.<br><i>The girls <b>squealed</b> with delight.</i>   |
| <b>tear</b>      | Fill with tears or shed tears.<br><i>His story brought <b>tears</b> to her eyes.</i>   |
| <b>threnody</b>  | A song or hymn of mourning composed or performed as a memorial to a dead person.<br><i>A brooding <b>threnody</b> to urban desolation.</i>   |
| <b>wail</b>      | Utter a wail.<br><i>She <b>wailed</b> with pain.</i>   |
| <b>whimper</b>   | A whimpering sound.<br><i>He s not dead is he she <b>whimpered</b>.</i>  |
| <b>whine</b>     | A feeble or petulant complaint.<br><i>The dog gave a small <b>whine</b>.</i>   |
