## Associations of "Wholeheartedly" (30 Words)

adherence	The property of sticking together (as of glue and wood) or the joining of surfaces of different composition. <i>Adherence</i> to a fat free diet.
<u>allegiance</u>	Loyalty or commitment to a superior or to a group or cause. A complex pattern of cross party <b>allegiance</b> s.
authenticity	Undisputed credibility. The paper should have established the <b>authenticity</b> of the documents before publishing them.
<u>candid</u>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. It is better to let the photographer mingle among the guests and take <b>candid</b> shots.
<u>candor</u>	Ability to make judgments free from discrimination or dishonesty.
<u>commitment</u>	A pledge or undertaking. His long <b>commitment</b> to public service.
<u>covenant</u>	An agreement which brings about a relationship of commitment between God and his people The Jewish faith is based on the biblical covenants made with Abraham Moses and David. <i>The landlord covenants to repair the property.</i>
<u>dedication</u>	An inscription or form of words dedicating a building, book, etc. to a person or deity. The <b>dedication</b> of a new city church.
<u>devotion</u>	Religious worship or observance. <i>He returned to his <b>devotion</b>s.</i>
encyclical	A letter from the pope sent to all Roman Catholic bishops throughout the world. An <b>encyclical</b> letter.



faithfully	In a loyal manner. She translated the novel as <b>faithfully</b> as possible.
faithfulness	The quality of being faithful; fidelity. <i>Faithfulness</i> in marriage.
fealty	The loyalty that citizens owe to their country (or subjects to their sovereign. <i>A property for which she did <b>fealty</b>.</i>
fidelity	Accuracy with which an electronic system reproduces the sound or image of its input signal. <i>His fidelity</i> to liberal ideals.
frank	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. To be perfectly <b>frank</b> I don t know.
<u>frankly</u>	In an open, honest, and direct manner. <i>Frankly</i> I was pleased to leave.
<u>honesty</u>	A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>They spoke with convincing <b>honesty</b> about their fears.</i>
loyalty	The act of binding yourself (intellectually or emotionally) to a course of action. They felt no <b>loyalty</b> to a losing team.
piety	A belief which is accepted with unthinking conventional reverence. <i>Acts of <b>piety</b> and charity.</i>
<u>pledge</u>	Bind or secure by a pledge. I <b>pledge</b> d 10 a month to my favorite radio station.
posterity	The descendants of a person. We must secure the benefits of freedom for ourselves and our <b>posterity</b> .
righteousness	Adhering to moral principles. We had little doubt about the <b>righteousness</b> of our cause.
<u>sanctity</u>	The quality of being holy. The site of the tomb was a place of <b>sanctity</b> for the ancient Egyptians.
<u>seriousness</u>	The quality of arousing fear or distress. He learned the <b>seriousness</b> of his illness.
<u>sincere</u>	Open and genuine; not deceitful. An entirely <b>sincere</b> and cruel tyrant.
<u>sincerity</u>	The absence of pretence, deceit, or hypocrisy. <i>His <b>sincerity</b> inspired belief.</i>



troth	Truth. A token of <b>troth</b> .
<u>truthfulness</u>	The quality of being truthful. We have had to judge the <b>truthfulness</b> of the evidence.
<u>undying</u>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>His <b>undying</b> fame.</i>
<u>veracity</u>	Conformity to facts; accuracy. <i>Voters should be concerned about his <b>veracity</b> and character.</i>
