Associations of "Wholeheartedly" (30 Words)

<u>adherence</u>	The property of sticking together (as of glue and wood) or the joining of surfaces of different composition. <i>Adherence to a fat free diet.</i>
<u>allegiance</u>	Loyalty or commitment to a superior or to a group or cause. <i>A complex pattern of cross party allegiances.</i>
authenticity	Undisputed credibility. <i>The paper should have established the authenticity of the documents before publishing them.</i>
<u>candid</u>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>It is better to let the photographer mingle among the guests and take candid shots.</i>
<u>candor</u>	Ability to make judgments free from discrimination or dishonesty.
<u>commitment</u>	A pledge or undertaking. <i>His long commitment to public service.</i>
<u>covenant</u>	An agreement which brings about a relationship of commitment between God and his people The Jewish faith is based on the biblical covenants made with Abraham Moses and David. <i>The landlord covenants to repair the property.</i>
<u>dedication</u>	An inscription or form of words dedicating a building, book, etc. to a person or deity. <i>The dedication of a new city church.</i>
<u>devotion</u>	Religious worship or observance. <i>He returned to his devotions.</i>
encyclical	A letter from the pope sent to all Roman Catholic bishops throughout the world. <i>An encyclical letter.</i>

faithfully	In a loyal manner. <i>She translated the novel as faithfully as possible.</i>
faithfulness	The quality of being faithful; fidelity. <i>Faithfulness in marriage.</i>
fealty	The loyalty that citizens owe to their country (or subjects to their sovereign). <i>A property for which she did fealty.</i>
fidelity	Accuracy with which an electronic system reproduces the sound or image of its input signal. <i>His fidelity to liberal ideals.</i>
frank	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>To be perfectly frank I don't know.</i>
<u>frankly</u>	In an open, honest, and direct manner. <i>Frankly I was pleased to leave.</i>
<u>honesty</u>	A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>They spoke with convincing honesty about their fears.</i>
loyalty	The act of binding yourself (intellectually or emotionally) to a course of action. <i>They felt no loyalty to a losing team.</i>
piety	A belief which is accepted with unthinking conventional reverence. <i>Acts of piety and charity.</i>
<u>pledge</u>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>I pledged 10 a month to my favorite radio station.</i>
posterity	The descendants of a person. <i>We must secure the benefits of freedom for ourselves and our posterity.</i>
righteousness	Adhering to moral principles. <i>We had little doubt about the righteousness of our cause.</i>
<u>sanctity</u>	The quality of being holy. <i>The site of the tomb was a place of sanctity for the ancient Egyptians.</i>
<u>seriousness</u>	The quality of arousing fear or distress. <i>He learned the seriousness of his illness.</i>
<u>sincere</u>	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>An entirely sincere and cruel tyrant.</i>
<u>sincerity</u>	The absence of pretence, deceit, or hypocrisy. <i>His sincerity inspired belief.</i>

troth	Truth. <i>A token of troth.</i>
<u>truthfulness</u>	The quality of being truthful. <i>We have had to judge the truthfulness of the evidence.</i>
<u>undying</u>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>His undying fame.</i>
<u>veracity</u>	Conformity to facts; accuracy. <i>Voters should be concerned about his veracity and character.</i>
