### Definitions of "Width" as a noun

- *The measurement or extent of something from side to side; the lesser of two or the least of three dimensions of a body.*
- *The sideways extent of a swimming pool as a measure of the distance swum.*
- *The extent of something from side to side.*
- *A piece of something at its full extent from side to side.*
- *Wide range or extent.*



## Synonyms of "Width" as a noun (20 Words)

**breadth**

Wide range or extent.

*The boat measured 27 feet in **breadth**.*

**broadness**

The property of being wide; having great width.

**compass**

An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it.

*Within the **compass** of education.*

**comprehensiveness**

The capacity to understand a broad range of topics.

*The depth and **comprehensiveness** of his knowledge is simply breathtaking.*

**diameter**

A straight line connecting the center of a circle with two points on its perimeter (or the center of a sphere with two points on its surface).

**expansiveness**

A friendly open trait of a talkative person.

*The **expansiveness** of their extravagant life style was soon curtailed.*

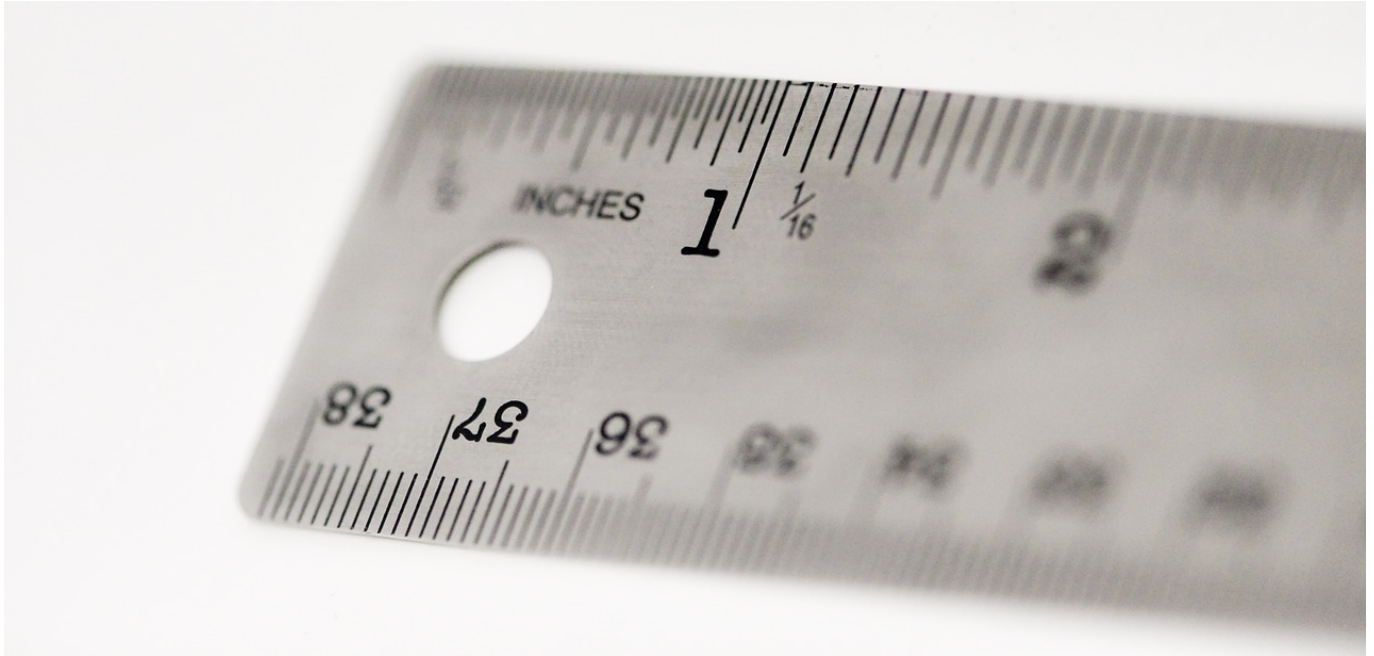
<b>extensiveness</b>	Large or extensive in breadth or importance or comprehensiveness. <i>The very <b>extensiveness</b> of his power was a temptation to abuse it.</i>
<b>extent</b>	The area covered by something. <i>Decision making was to a large <b>extent</b> outside his control.</i>
<b>girth</b>	The distance around a person's body. <i>An ivy clad tree of immense <b>girth</b>.</i>
<b>immenseness</b>	Unusual largeness in size or extent or number.
<b>immensity</b>	The extremely large size, scale, or extent of something. <i>I have no illusions about the <b>immensity</b> of this task.</i>
<b>range</b>	A series of hills or mountains. <i>Grand hotels were outside my price <b>range</b>.</i>
<b>scale</b>	A white deposit formed in a kettle, boiler, etc. by the evaporation of water containing lime. <i>The <b>scale</b> of the map.</i>
<b>scope</b>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Within the <b>scope</b> of an investigation.</i>
<b>span</b>	The wingspan of an aircraft or a bird. <i>The gannets had black tipped wings with a six foot <b>span</b>.</i>
<b>spread</b>	The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>They put out quite a <b>spread</b>.</i>
<b>sweep</b>	A sweepstake. <i>The police finished their <b>sweep</b> through the woods.</i>
<b>thickness</b>	A broad or deep part of a specified thing. <i>He gave his eyes time to adjust to the <b>thickness</b> of the fog.</i>
<b>vastness</b>	Unusual largeness in size or extent or number. <i>The <b>vastness</b> of the Atlantic Ocean.</i>
<b>wideness</b>	Unusual largeness in size or extent or number.



### **Usage Examples of "Width" as a noun**

- *The width of experience required for these positions.*
- *A single width of hardboard.*
- *The yard was about seven feet in width.*





## Associations of "Width" (30 Words)

- bottleneck** The style of playing that uses a bottleneck.  
*Animated films are still stymied by a technological **bottleneck**.*
- breadth** A piece of cloth of standard or full width.  
*The boat measured 27 feet in **breadth**.*
- constricted** Drawn together or squeezed physically or by extension psychologically.  
*A **constricted** blood vessel.*
- cramped** (of handwriting) small and difficult to read.  
***Cramped** quarters.*
- dense** Hard to pass through because of dense growth.  
***Dense** as lead.*
- diaphanous** (especially of fabric) light, delicate, and translucent.  
*A hat with a **diaphanous** veil.*
- elongated** Long in relation to width, especially unusually so.  
*Picasso's **elongated** Don Quixote.*
- extent** The particular degree to which something is or is believed to be the case.  
*The **extent** of the damage.*
- foyer** An entrance hall or other open area in a building used by the public, especially a hotel or theatre.  
*The **foyer** of the concert hall.*

<b>gangling</b>	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A <b>gangling</b> youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>
<b>gangly</b>	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.
<b>lissom</b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>membrane</b>	A thin pliable sheet of material forming a barrier or lining. <i>The mucous <b>membrane</b>.</i>
<b>narrow</b>	Make or become more narrow or restricted. <i>I cannot <b>narrow</b> down the rules for this game.</i>
<b>narrowed</b>	Reduced in size as by squeezing together. <i><b>Narrowed</b> arteries impair blood circulation.</i>
<b>packed</b>	Filled to capacity. <i><b>Packed</b> snow.</i>
<b>poky</b>	Small and remote and insignificant. <i>Passed a series of <b>poky</b> little one horse towns.</i>
<b>scope</b>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>It is important that a project is <b>scoped</b> correctly to ensure the budget can be accurately defined.</i>
<b>size</b>	Alter or sort in terms of size or according to size. <i>Average <b>size</b> house.</i>
<b>skinny</b>	A skinny person. <i>I love jeans either bootcut or <b>skinny</b>.</i>
<b>slender</b>	Being of delicate or slender build. <i>People of <b>slender</b> means.</i>
<b>slice</b>	Cut something especially food into slices. <i>A <b>slice</b> of bread.</i>
<b>streamlined</b>	Having been made simpler and more efficient or effective. <i>Short <b>streamlined</b> meetings.</i>
<b>swath</b>	A path or strip (as cut by one course of mowing).
<b>taper</b>	Gradually lessen. <i>The strong <b>taper</b> of her back.</i>
<b>thick</b>	Not thin of a specific thickness or of relatively great extent from one surface to the opposite usually in the smallest of the three solid dimensions. <i><b>Thick</b> fog.</i>
<b>thin</b>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i><b>Thin</b> out the rows of peas.</i>

**underweight** Invest in (a market sector, industry, etc.) to a lesser than normal degree.  
*We feared the hot air balloon had been **underweighted**.*

**wiry** Of hair that resembles wire in stiffness.  
*Bernadette was a small **wiry** woman.*

**withered** (used especially of vegetation) having lost all moisture.  
***Withered** vines.*
