## **Wife as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Wife" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “wife” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The wife of a person with a specified occupation.*
- *A woman, especially an old or uneducated one.*
- *A married woman; a man's partner in marriage.*
- *A married woman considered in relation to her spouse.*



## Synonyms of "Wife" as a noun (6 Words)

### consort

A family of similar musical instrument playing together.  
*Queen Victoria and her **consort** Prince Albert.*

**married woman** A person who is married.

### **mate**

South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate.  
*Camels hate leaving their **mates**.*

### partner

A person's partner in marriage.  
*Sexual **partners**.*

### spouse

A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.

### **woman**

A disrespectful form of address to a woman.  
*A daily **woman**.*



## Usage Examples of "Wife" as a noun

- *He and his wife are keen gardeners.*
- *A clergy wife.*

- bachelor** Lead a bachelor's existence.  
*One of the country's most eligible **bachelors**.*
- beau** A man who is much concerned with his dress and appearance.
- bigamy** Having two spouses at the same time.
- boyfriend** A man who is the lover of a man or woman.  
*A **boyfriend** cardigan.*
- cohabit** Exist together.  
*Animals that can **cohabit** with humans thrive.*
- concubine** A mistress.
- couple** Connect (a railway vehicle or a piece of equipment) to another.  
*A sense of hope is **coupled** with a palpable sense of loss.*
- darling** A lovable or endearing person.  
*A **darling** little pillbox hat.*

<b>estranged</b>	(of a person) no longer close or affectionate to someone; alienated. <i>Harriet felt more <b>estranged</b> from her daughter than ever.</i>
<b>ex</b>	Out of fashion. <i>All his <b>exes</b> live in Texas.</i>
<b>fiance</b>	A man who is engaged to be married.
<b>fiancee</b>	A woman who is engaged to be married.
<b>girlfriend</b>	Any female friend. <i>Mary and her <b>girlfriend</b> organized the party.</i>
<b>guy</b>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>He s a nice <b>guy</b>.</i>
<b>harridan</b>	A scolding (even vicious) old woman. <i>A bullying old <b>harridan</b>.</i>
<b>husband</b>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She and her <b>husband</b> are both retired.</i>
<b>lover</b>	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>Music <b>lovers</b>.</i>
<b>marriage</b>	A combination or mixture of elements. <i>Her music is a <b>marriage</b> of funk jazz and hip hop.</i>
<b>married</b>	Married people. <i>A <b>married</b> man.</i>
<b>marry</b>	(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage. <i>Eric asked me to <b>marry</b> him.</i>
<b>mistress</b>	A woman who is skilled in a particular subject or activity. <i>Mary go and fetch your <b>mistress</b> some cold chicken.</i>
<b>moll</b>	A prostitute. <i>I d rush the money over to his <b>moll</b>.</i>
<b>morganatic</b>	Of a marriage between one of royal or noble birth and one of lower rank; valid but with the understanding that the rank of the inferior remains unchanged and offspring do not succeed to titles or property of the superior. <i>He contracted a <b>morganatic</b> marriage with a German born actress.</i>
<b>newlywed</b>	Someone recently married.
<b>paramour</b>	A lover, especially the illicit partner of a married person.
<b>partner</b>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>She lived with her <b>partner</b>.</i>
<b>polygamy</b>	The condition or practice of having more than one spouse at a time.
<b>spouse</b>	A person's partner in marriage.

**wed**

Be obstinately attached or devoted to (an activity, belief, or system).  
*He was to **wed** the king's daughter.*

**widower**

A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried.  
*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*
