- A wooded region in northeastern Virginia near Spotsylvania where bloody but inconclusive battles were fought in the American Civil War.
- A neglected or abandoned area.
- A position of disfavour, especially in a political context.
- A wild and uninhabited area left in its natural condition.







Synonyms of "Wilderness" as a noun (8 Words)

<u>badlands</u>	A barren plateau region of the western US, mainly in North and South Dakota and Nebraska.
neglected area	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern.
no-man's-land	Agriculture considered as an occupation or way of life.
uninhabited region	A large indefinite location on the surface of the Earth.
<u>wasteland</u>	An uninhabited wilderness that is worthless for cultivation. We d creep through a hole in the fence on this bit of wasteland and play games in the bushes.
wastes	An uninhabited wilderness that is worthless for cultivation. <i>The trackless wastes of the desert.</i>
wild	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization. <i>He lived in the wild.</i>
wilds	A wild and uninhabited area left in its natural condition. They collected mushrooms in the wild.





Usage Examples of "Wilderness" as a noun

- The duties of citizenship are lost sight of in the wilderness of interests of individuals and groups.
- The man who led the Labour Party out of the wilderness.
- A wilderness of masts in the harbor.
- *He led the Democratic party back from the wilderness.*
- His wilderness years.
- The garden had become a wilderness of weeds and bushes.
- It was a wilderness preserved for the hawks and mountaineers.





Associations of "Wilderness" (30 Words)

acreage	An area of ground used for some particular purpose (such as building or farming. A 35 per cent increase in net acreage .
adventure	A commercial venture. She travelled the world in search of adventure .
<u>beach</u>	Land on a beach. Competitive procurement seems to have beach ed several firms.
<u>bumpy</u>	(of a surface) uneven, with many patches raised above the rest. The car jolted on the bumpy road.
coastal	Located on or near or bordering on a coast. <i>Coastal</i> waters.
countryside	The inhabitants of countryside areas. The political influence of the countryside remains strong.



craggy	(of a landscape) having many crags. A craggy coastline.
deforest	Clear (an area) of forests or trees. The landscape was deforest ed by the enemy attacks.
<u>desert</u>	Desert a cause a country or an army often in order to join the opposing cause country or army. <i>Her luck deserted her.</i>
dune	A mound or ridge of sand or other loose sediment formed by the wind, especially on the sea coast or in a desert. <i>A sand dune</i> .
foreshore	The part of the seashore between the highwater mark and the low-water mark.
gravelly	(of a voice) deep and rough-sounding. A gravelly voice.
hilly	Having many hills. A remote hilly district.
<u>incapable</u>	Unable to do or achieve (something. <i>Incapable</i> of solution.
jagged	Having a sharply uneven surface or outline. The jagged edges gashed their fingers.
land	Bring a fish to land with a net or rod. <i>He landed his troops at Hastings.</i>
landlocked	(of a country or region) almost or entirely surrounded by land. <i>Maine s landlocked</i> sebago salmon.
mountainous	Having hills and crags. Struggling under mountainous debts.
nature	The complex of emotional and intellectual attributes that determine a person's characteristic actions and reactions. It s not in her nature to listen to advice.
oasis	A fertile spot in a desert, where water is found. The park is an oasis of calm in the centre of the city.
pebble	A small smooth rounded rock. A narrow pebble beach.
rock	A mass of rock projecting above the earth s surface or out of the sea. The new system is heading for the rock s.
<u>rugged</u>	(of ground or terrain) having a broken, rocky, and uneven surface. <i>The rugged conditions of frontier life</i> .



sandy	Resembling or containing or abounding in sand or growing in sandy areas. <i>Pale eyes and receding sandy hair.</i>
sediment	Deposit as a sediment. The DNA was sediment ed by centrifugation.
<u>soil</u>	Make soiled filthy or dirty. Don t soil your clothes when you play outside.
stony	Showing unfeeling resistance to tender feelings. Lucenzo s hard stony eyes.
<u>uneven</u>	Variable and recurring at irregular intervals. An uneven color.
<u>wasted</u>	Under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs. <i>Wasted</i> fuel.
