Definitions of "Willingly" as an adverb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "willingly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- Readily; of one's own free will.
- In a willing manner.

Synonyms of "Willingly" as an adverb (3 Words)

by choice In reserve; not for immediate use. volitionally In a willing manner.

voluntarily Of one's own free will. He **voluntarily** attended a police station.

Usage Examples of "Willingly" as an adverb

- *She went willingly.*
- I willingly accept.

The tumor was not amenable to surgical treatment.

(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward.

He is **apt** to lose.

cheerfully In a way that inspires feelings of happiness.

He **cheerfully** admits to being the wrong side of fifty.

compliant Disposed or willing to comply.

The conversion of the gel to a much less **compliant** rigid glass.

deservedly In the way that is deserved; rightfully.

A **deservedly** popular sitcom.

Not earmarked; available for use as needed.

discretionary Discretionary income.

disposed

Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward.

He is favourably **disposed** towards the proposals.

enjoin Instruct or urge (someone) to do something.

He was **enjoin**ed from using the patent.

fain Having made preparations.

I am weary and would **fain** get a little rest.

given Specified or stated.

Given the engine s condition it is a wonder that it started.

In a willing manner.

This was **gladly** agreed to.

Express greetings upon meeting someone.

Some of the customers **greet**ed the barman in Gaelic.

In a happy way.

happily Happily today s situation is very different.

inclined At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position.

An **inclined** ramp.

luckily It is fortunate that.

Luckily for me it s worked out.

minded Naturally disposed toward.

I am not **minded** to answer any questions.



obedience Observance of a monastic rule. **Obedience** to moral standards.

obedient Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority.

Obedient children.

Behave in accordance with (a general principle, natural law, etc.

The universe was complex but it **obey**ed certain rules.

partiality Unfair bias in favour of one person or thing; favouritism.

Miller's **partiality** for flowering shrubs is evident.

participation The action of taking part in something.

Participation in chapel activities.

Lying flat, especially face downwards.

A **prone** position.

Something (manuscripts or architectural plans and models or estimates or

works of art of all genres etc.) submitted for the judgment of others (as in a

submission competition.

A written **submission** to the UN.

submissive Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams.

She has become **submissive** and subservient.

thankfully Let us be thankful that.

He accepted **thankfully** my apologies.

tractable Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded.

Trying to make the mathematics **tractable**.

volitional Relating to the use of one's will.

Acceptance is a **volitional** act.

voluntary Under the conscious control of the brain.

A **voluntary** confession.

willing The act of making a choice.

Willing and prompt obedience.
