## Willingly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Willingly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “willingly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Readily; of one's own free will.*
- *In a willing manner.*

### Synonyms of "Willingly" as an adverb (3 Words)

**by choice** In reserve; not for immediate use.

**volitionally** In a willing manner.

**voluntarily** Of one's own free will.  
*He **voluntarily** attended a police station.*

### Usage Examples of "Willingly" as an adverb

- *She went willingly.*
- *I willingly accept.*

## Associations of "Willingly" (30 Words)

<b>act</b>	Take action do something. <i>I <b>acted</b> dumb at first.</i>
<b>amenable</b>	Liable to answer to a higher authority. <i>The tumor was not <b>amenable</b> to surgical treatment.</i>
<b>apt</b>	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward. <i>He is <b>apt</b> to lose.</i>
<b>cheerfully</b>	In a way that inspires feelings of happiness. <i>He <b>cheerfully</b> admits to being the wrong side of fifty.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>The conversion of the gel to a much less <b>compliant</b> rigid glass.</i>
<b>deservedly</b>	In the way that is deserved; rightfully. <i>A <b>deservedly</b> popular sitcom.</i>
<b>discretionary</b>	Not earmarked; available for use as needed. <i><b>Discretionary</b> income.</i>
<b>disposed</b>	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>He is favourably <b>disposed</b> towards the proposals.</i>
<b>enjoin</b>	Instruct or urge (someone) to do something. <i>He was <b>enjoined</b> from using the patent.</i>
<b>fain</b>	Having made preparations. <i>I am weary and would <b>fain</b> get a little rest.</i>
<b>given</b>	Specified or stated. <i><b>Given</b> the engine's condition it is a wonder that it started.</i>
<b>gladly</b>	In a willing manner. <i>This was <b>gladly</b> agreed to.</i>
<b>greet</b>	Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>Some of the customers <b>greeted</b> the barman in Gaelic.</i>
<b>happily</b>	In a happy way. <i><b>Happily</b> today's situation is very different.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. <i>An <b>inclined</b> ramp.</i>
<b>luckily</b>	It is fortunate that. <i><b>Luckily</b> for me it's worked out.</i>
<b>minded</b>	Naturally disposed toward. <i>I am not <b>minded</b> to answer any questions.</i>

<b><u>obedience</u></b>	Observance of a monastic rule. <b>Obedience</b> to moral standards.
<b><u>obedient</u></b>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <b>Obedient</b> children.
<b><u>obey</u></b>	Behave in accordance with (a general principle, natural law, etc). <i>The universe was complex but it <b>obeyed</b> certain rules.</i>
<b>partiality</b>	Unfair bias in favour of one person or thing; favouritism. <i>Miller's <b>partiality</b> for flowering shrubs is evident.</i>
<b>participation</b>	The action of taking part in something. <b>Participation</b> in chapel activities.
<b><u>prone</u></b>	Lying flat, especially face downwards. A <b>prone</b> position.
<b>submission</b>	Something (manuscripts or architectural plans and models or estimates or works of art of all genres etc.) submitted for the judgment of others (as in a competition). <i>A written <b>submission</b> to the UN.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i>She has become <b>submissive</b> and subservient.</i>
<b><u>thankfully</u></b>	Let us be thankful that. <i>He accepted <b>thankfully</b> my apologies.</i>
<b><u>tractable</u></b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded). <i>Trying to make the mathematics <b>tractable</b>.</i>
<b>volitional</b>	Relating to the use of one's will. <i>Acceptance is a <b>volitional</b> act.</i>
<b><u>voluntary</u></b>	Under the conscious control of the brain. <i>A <b>voluntary</b> confession.</i>
<b><u>willing</u></b>	The act of making a choice. <b>Willing</b> and prompt obedience.
