### Definitions of "Window" as a noun

- *A space behind the window of a shop where goods are displayed for sale.*
- *Strips of metal foil dispersed in the air to obstruct radar detection.*
- *A framework of wood or metal that contains a glass windowpane and is built into a wall or roof to admit light or air.*
- *A range of electromagnetic wavelengths for which a medium (especially the atmosphere) is transparent.*
- *The time period that is considered best for starting or finishing something.*
- *A means of observing and learning about something.*
- *An interval during which atmospheric and astronomical circumstances are suitable for the launch of a spacecraft.*
- *A pane of glass in a window.*
- *(computer science) a rectangular part of a computer screen that contains a display different from the rest of the screen.*
- *An opening in the wall or roof of a building or vehicle, fitted with glass in a frame to admit light or air and allow people to see out.*
- *A rectangular part of a computer screen that contains a display different from the rest*

*of the screen.*

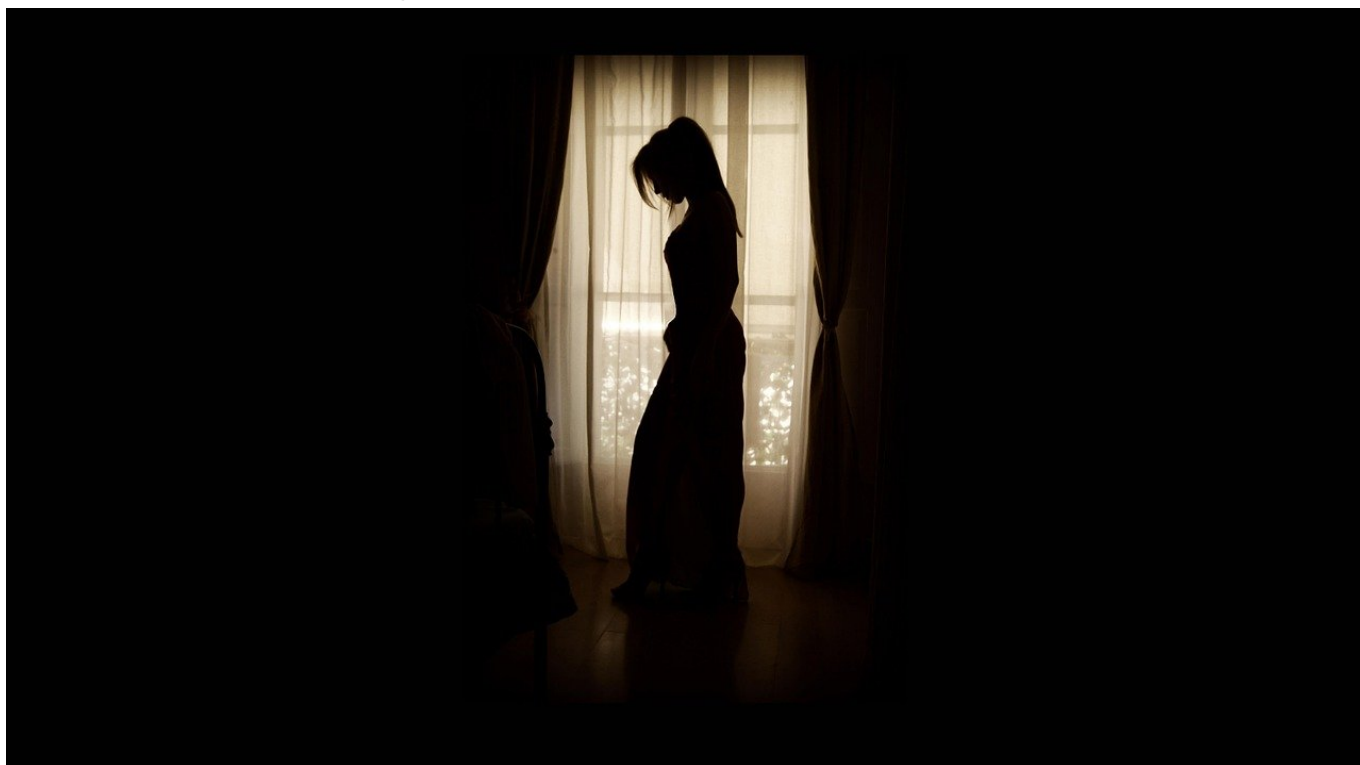
- *An interval or opportunity for action.*
- *An opening that resembles a window in appearance or function.*
- *A transparent panel on an envelope to show an address.*
- *A framed area on a display screen for viewing information.*
- *A pane of glass filling a window.*
- *A transparent opening in a vehicle that allow vision out of the sides or back; usually is capable of being opened.*
- *A transparent panel (as of an envelope) inserted in an otherwise opaque material.*
- *An opening in a wall or screen through which customers are served in a bank, ticket office, or similar building.*
- *An opening in a wall or screen that admits light and air and through which customers can be served.*

**aperture**      A natural opening in something.  
A refracting telescope with an **aperture** of 3 inches.

<b>casement</b>	The sash of a sash window. <i><b>Casement</b> windows.</i>
<b>chance</b>	An opportunity to do or achieve something. <i>We ran into each other by pure <b>chance</b>.</i>
<b>opening</b>	The act of opening something. <i>There are few <b>openings</b> for the ex footballer.</i>
<b>opportunity</b>	A chance for employment or promotion. <i>The night drive gave us the <b>opportunity</b> of spotting rhinos.</i>
<b>right moment</b>	Anything in accord with principles of justice.
<b>windowpane</b>	A pane of glass in a window.

**admittance** A measure of electrical conduction, numerically equal to the reciprocal of the impedance.

*People were unable to gain **admittance** to the hall.*

**bungalow** A small house with a single story.

**cabinet** A piece of furniture resembling a cupboard with doors and shelves and drawers; for storage or display.

*A **cabinet** meeting.*

**ceiling** The maximum altitude that a particular aircraft can reach.

*He put a **ceiling** on the number of women who worked for him.*

**console** Give moral or emotional strength to.

*The bust of Napoleon stood on a **console**.*



<b>damper</b>	A depressing restraint. <i>This will be a <b>damper</b> on the liberal agenda for the next couple of years.</i>
<b>door</b>	A doorway. <i>The office next <b>door</b>.</i>
<b>doorway</b>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>He stuck his head in the <b>doorway</b>.</i>
<b>dormer</b>	A gabled extension built out from a sloping roof to accommodate a vertical window.
<b>entrance</b>	A movement into or inward. <i>An <b>entrance</b> hall.</i>
<b>exit</b>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>She slipped out by the rear <b>exit</b>.</i>
<b>fanlight</b>	A window in a roof to admit daylight.
<b>frame</b>	A structural environment within which a class of words or other linguistic units can be correctly used For example I him is a frame for a large class of transitive verbs. <i>An utterance may mean the opposite of what it says if used within a <b>frame</b> of teasing.</i>
<b>gate</b>	Control with a valve or other device that functions like a gate. <i>An average home <b>gate</b> of more than 12 000.</i>
<b>gateway</b>	A device used to connect two different networks, especially a connection to the internet. <i>To me a home in the country was a <b>gateway</b> to happiness.</i>
<b>hinge</b>	Attach or join with or as if with a hinge. <i>The ironing board was set into the wall and <b>hinged</b> at the bottom.</i>
<b>jamb</b>	Upright consisting of a vertical side member of a door or window frame. <i>He leaned against the door <b>jamb</b>.</i>
<b>latticed</b>	Decorated with or in the form of a lattice. <i>A <b>latticed</b> screen.</i>
<b>lintel</b>	Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window.
<b>lobby</b>	In the UK lobby correspondents collectively. <i>They insist on their right to <b>lobby</b> Congress.</i>
<b>pane</b>	A panel or section of panels in a wall or door.
<b>porch</b>	A veranda. <i>The north <b>porch</b> of Hereford Cathedral.</i>

<b>portal</b>	A grand and imposing entrance (often extended metaphorically). <i>The <b>portals</b> of heaven.</i>
<b>porthole</b>	An opening for firing a cannon through.
<u>roof</u>	Function as the roof of. <i>A thatched <b>roof</b>.</i>
<u>room</u>	The people present in a room. <i>He was trapped without <b>room</b> to move.</i>
<b>sill</b>	A strong horizontal beam forming a base in the frame of a timber-framed building.
<b>skylight</b>	A window in a roof to admit daylight.
<u>slam</u>	A grand slam all thirteen tricks or small slam twelve tricks for which bonus points are scored if bid and made. <i>Charlie <b>slammed</b> down the phone.</i>
<b>threshold</b>	The magnitude or intensity that must be exceeded for a certain reaction, phenomenon, result, or condition to occur or be manifested. <i>He stood on the <b>threshold</b> of Sheila's bedroom.</i>
