- *A card that can be relied on to win a trick.*
- *A person with a record of successes.*
- *A goal or shot that wins a match or point.*



## Synonyms of "Winner" as a noun (12 Words)

<b>achiever</b>	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
<b>box-office success</b>	An event that accomplishes its intended purpose.
<b>champion</b>	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>
<b>conqueror</b>	A person who conquers a place or people; a vanquisher. <i>A people ruled over by a foreign <b>conqueror</b>.</i>
<b>defeater</b>	The feeling that accompanies an experience of being thwarted in attaining your goals. <i>The onset of hopelessness is the great <b>defeater</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>hero</u></a>	A person who is admired for their courage, outstanding achievements, or noble qualities. <i>The <b>hero</b> of the range is the daily face peel.</i>

**sensation**

The capacity to have physical sensations.  
*She was a **sensation** the talk of the evening.*

**succeeder**

A person who takes over or inherits a throne, office, or other position.  
*You re more likely to become a **succeeder** if you try and try and try.*

**success**

A person with a record of successes.  
*Her **success** owed more to hard work than luck.*

**triumph**

The exultation of victory.  
*A garden built to celebrate Napoleon s many **triumphs**.*

**vanquisher**

Someone who is victorious by force of arms.

**victor**

A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication.  
*Congratulations to the **victors**.*

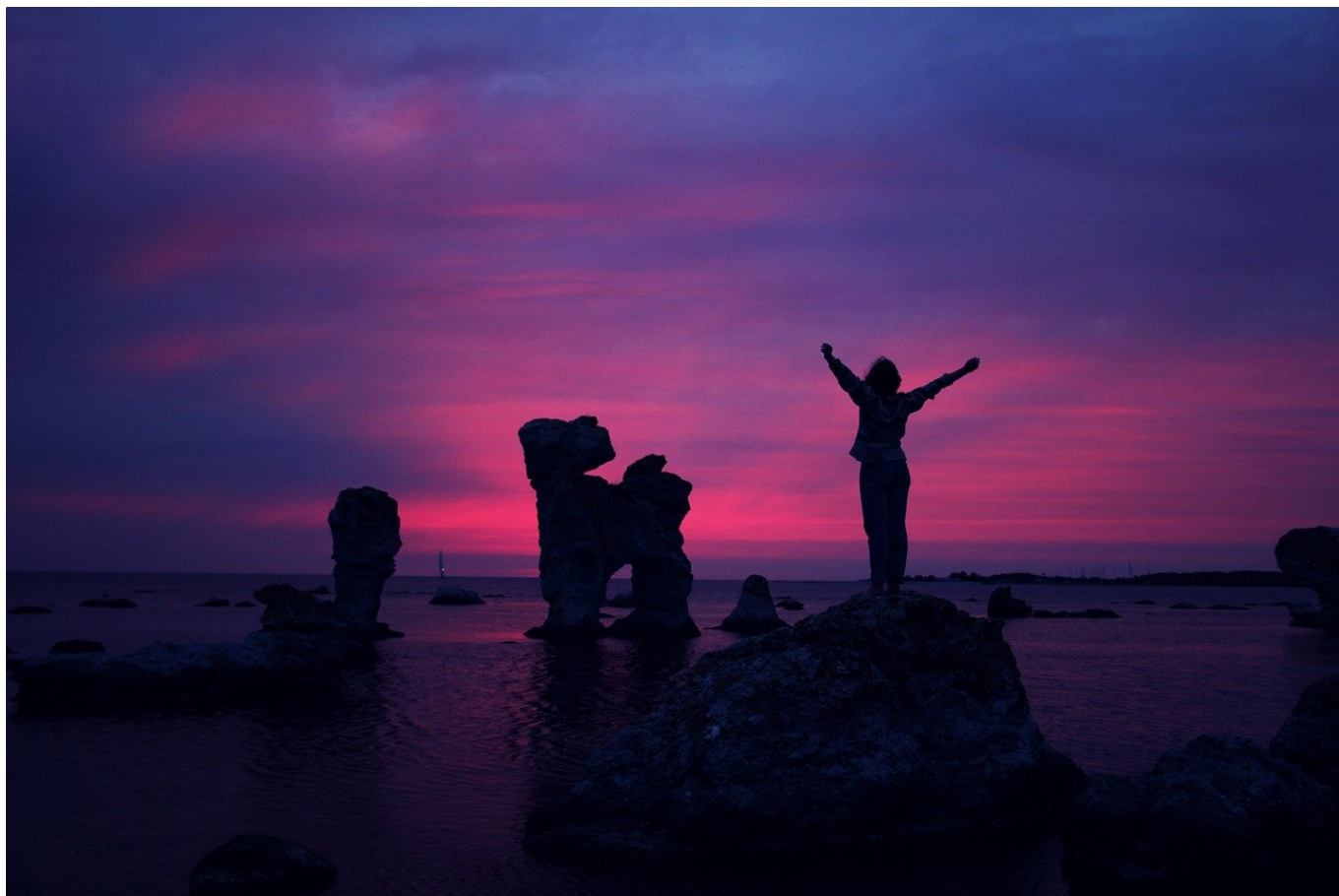


**Usage Examples of "Winner" as a noun**

<b>accomplishment</b>	Something that has been achieved successfully. <i>The <b>accomplishment</b> of planned objectives.</i>
<b>achiever</b>	A person with a record of successes. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
<a href="#"><u>athlete</u></a>	A person who takes part in competitive track and field events (athletics). <i>He had the broad shouldered build of a natural <b>athlete</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>award</u></a>	Grant or assign (a contract or commission) to (a person or organization). <i>An <b>award</b> of damages.</i>
<b>champion</b>	Protect or fight for as a champion. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>

<b>championship</b>	The position or title of the winner of a championship contest. <i>The team's final match before the European <b>championships</b>.</i>
<b>competition</b>	A business relation in which two parties compete to gain customers. <i>A beauty <b>competition</b>.</i>
<b>conqueror</b>	Someone who is victorious by force of arms. <i>A chance for revenge against his Olympic <b>conqueror</b>.</i>
<b>exultation</b>	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in <b>exultation</b>.</i>
<b>heroism</b>	Great bravery. <i>They fought with exemplary <b>heroism</b>.</i>
<b>honored</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<b><u>invincible</u></b>	Incapable of being overcome or subdued. <i>An <b>invincible</b> army.</i>
<b>jogger</b>	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>Sporty types in <b>joggers</b>.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>jubilation</b>	A feeling of great happiness and triumph. <i>Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b>.</i>
<b>marathon</b>	Any long and arduous undertaking. <i>A <b>marathon</b> runner.</i>
<b>marathoner</b>	Someone who participates in long-distance races (especially in marathons).
<b>nobel</b>	Swedish chemist remembered for his invention of dynamite and for the bequest that created the Nobel prizes (1833-1896).
<b><u>oppressor</u></b>	A person of authority who subjects others to undue pressures. <i>They overthrew their colonial <b>oppressors</b>.</i>
<b>pugilist</b>	Someone who fights with his fists for sport.
<b>pugnacious</b>	Eager or quick to argue, quarrel, or fight. <i><b>Pugnacious</b> spirits lamented that there was so little prospect of an exhilarating disturbance.</i>
<b>rejoicing</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general <b>rejoicing</b>.</i>
<b>runner</b>	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>He came in to bat with a <b>runner</b>.</i>

<b>success</b>	A person with a record of successes. <i>I must make a <b>success</b> of my business.</i>
<b>superior</b>	A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a higher position. <i>Mars and Jupiter are the closest in of the <b>superior</b> planets.</i>
<u>triumph</u>	Dwell on with satisfaction. <i>She stopped <b>triumphing</b> over Mrs Ward s failure.</i>
<u>triumphant</u>	Feeling or expressing jubilation after a victory or achievement. <i>A comic fairy tale about innocence <b>triumphant</b>.</i>
<u>trophy</u>	A souvenir of an achievement, especially a part of an animal taken when hunting.
<b>victor</b>	A person who defeats an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>Congratulations to the <b>victors</b>.</i>
<u>victory</u>	An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>Clinched a <b>victory</b>.</i>
