
## Winner as a Noun

- A thing that is a success or is likely to be successful.
- A card that can be relied on to win a trick.
- A person with a record of successes.
- A goal or shot that wins a match or point.





## Synonyms of "Winner" as a noun (12 Words)

achiever	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
box-office success	An event that accomplishes its intended purpose.
champion	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>
conqueror	A person who conquers a place or people; a vanquisher. A people ruled over by a foreign <b>conqueror</b> .
defeater	The feeling that accompanies an experience of being thwarted in attaining your goals. The onset of hopelessness is the great <b>defeater</b> .
<u>hero</u>	A person who is admired for their courage, outstanding achievements, or noble qualities. The <b>hero</b> of the range is the daily face peel.



<u>sensation</u>	The capacity to have physical sensations. She was a <b>sensation</b> the talk of the evening.
succeeder	A person who takes over or inherits a throne, office, or other position. You re more likely to become a <b>succeeder</b> if you try and try and try.
success	A person with a record of successes. Her <b>success</b> owed more to hard work than luck.
<u>triumph</u>	The exultation of victory. A garden built to celebrate Napoleon s many <b>triumph</b> s.
vanquisher	Someone who is victorious by force of arms.
victor	A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication. <i>Congratulations to the victors</i> .

- Dummy has the spade ace and two diamond winners at the finish.
- A Nobel Prize winner.

accomplishment	Something that has been achieved successfully. The <b>accomplishment</b> of planned objectives.
achiever	A person with a record of successes. His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.
<u>athlete</u>	A person who takes part in competitive track and field events (athletics). <i>He had the broad shouldered build of a natural <b>athlete</b>.</i>
<u>award</u>	Grant or assign (a contract or commission) to (a person or organization. <i>An <b>award</b> of damages.</i>
champion	Protect or fight for as a champion. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>



championship	The position or title of the winner of a championship contest. The team s final match before the European <b>championship</b> s.
competition	A business relation in which two parties compete to gain customers. A beauty <b>competition</b> .
conqueror	Someone who is victorious by force of arms. A chance for revenge against his Olympic <b>conqueror</b> .
exultation	A feeling of extreme joy. She laughs in <b>exultation</b> .
heroism	Great bravery. They fought with exemplary <b>heroism</b> .
honored	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<u>invincible</u>	Incapable of being overcome or subdued. An <b>invincible</b> army.
jogger	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>Sporty types in joggers.</i>
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
jubilation	A feeling of great happiness and triumph. Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b> .
marathon	Any long and arduous undertaking. A <b>marathon</b> runner.
marathoner	Someone who participates in long-distance races (especially in marathons.
nobel	Swedish chemist remembered for his invention of dynamite and for the bequest that created the Nobel prizes (1833-1896.
<u>oppressor</u>	A person of authority who subjects others to undue pressures. They overthrew their colonial <b>oppressor</b> s.
pugilist	Someone who fights with his fists for sport.
pugnacious	Eager or quick to argue, quarrel, or fight. <b>Pugnacious</b> spirits lamented that there was so little prospect of an exhilarating disturbance.
rejoicing	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general <b>rejoicing</b> .
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>He came in to bat with a <b>runner</b>.</i>



success	A person with a record of successes. I must make a <b>success</b> of my business.
superior	A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a higher position. Mars and Jupiter are the closest in of the <b>superior</b> planets.
<u>triumph</u>	Dwell on with satisfaction. She stopped <b>triumph</b> ing over Mrs Ward s failure.
<u>triumphant</u>	Feeling or expressing jubilation after a victory or achievement. A comic fairy tale about innocence <b>triumphant</b> .
<u>trophy</u>	A souvenir of an achievement, especially a part of an animal taken when hunting.
victor	A person who defeats an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>Congratulations to the victors.</i>
<u>victory</u>	An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>Clinched a victory</i> .
