### Definitions of "Witchcraft" as a noun

- *The art of sorcery.*
- *(in a modern context) religious practice involving magic and affinity with nature, usually within a pagan tradition.*
- *Bewitching or fascinating attraction or charm.*
- *The practice of magic, especially for evil purposes; the use of spells.*



## Synonyms of "Witchcraft" as a noun (13 Words)

<b>black magic</b>	Black clothing (worn as a sign of mourning).
<b>divination</b>	Successful conjecture by unusual insight or good luck. <i>The Celtic art of <b>divination</b>.</i>
<b>hoodoo</b>	Something believed to bring bad luck. <i>A visit to a local <b>hoodoo</b> doctor.</i>
<b>necromancy</b>	The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in order to predict the future. <i>Alchemy <b>necromancy</b> and other magic practices.</i>
<b>occultism</b>	A belief in supernatural powers and the possibility of bringing them under human control.
<b>sorcery</b>	The use of magic, especially black magic.
<b>the black arts</b>	Total absence of light.
<b>the occult</b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively.
<b>voodoo</b>	A person skilled in voodoo. <i>A <b>voodoo</b> doll.</i>
<b>voodooism</b>	A religious cult practiced chiefly in Caribbean countries (especially Haiti); involves witchcraft and animistic deities.
<b>witchery</b>	The art of sorcery. <i>Warding off evil spirits and acts of <b>witchery</b>.</i>
<b>witching</b>	The use or practice of witchcraft. <i>My hideous appearance and <b>witching</b> skills.</i>
<b>wizardry</b>	Great skill in a particular area of activity. <i>Pless s <b>wizardry</b> with a bat.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Witchcraft" as a noun

## Associations of "Witchcraft" (30 Words)

**amulet**

A trinket or piece of jewelry usually hung about the neck and thought to be a magical protection against evil or disease.

**ancient**

A person who lived in ancient times.

**Ancient** Greece.

**astrologer**

A person who uses astrology to tell others about their character or to predict their future.

*He was advised by **astrologers** to delay his departure.*

**bewitchment** A magical spell.



<b>charmed</b>	Strongly attracted. <i>I felt that I had a <b>charmed</b> life.</i>
<b><u>conjure</u></b>	Call (an image) to the mind. <i>A special tune that <b>conjures</b> up a particular time and place.</i>
<b>coven</b>	A group or meeting of witches. <i><b>Covens</b> of militants within the party.</i>
<b>crone</b>	An ugly old woman.
<b>disbelieve</b>	Have no religious faith. <i>To <b>disbelieve</b> is as much an act of faith as belief.</i>
<b>divination</b>	The art or gift of prophecy (or the pretense of prophecy) by supernatural means. <i>The mediums are hired to perform <b>divinations</b>.</i>
<b>genie</b>	An invisible spirit mentioned in the Koran and believed by Muslims to inhabit the earth and influence mankind by appearing in the form of humans or animals.
<b><u>goddess</u></b>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>He had an affair with a screen <b>goddess</b>.</i>
<b>magic</b>	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>It was a great time <b>magic</b>.</i>
<b><u>magical</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>A <b>magical</b> spell.</i>
<b><u>magician</u></b>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b><u>mystic</u></b>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i><b>Mystical</b> religion.</i>
<b><u>myth</u></b>	A fictitious or imaginary person or thing. <i>The belief that evening primrose oil helps to cure eczema is a <b>myth</b> according to dermatologists.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	A person who practises necromancy; a wizard or magician. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b>necromancy</b>	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world. <i>Alchemy <b>necromancy</b> and other magic practices.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	Involving or relating to mystical, supernatural, or magical powers, practices, or phenomena. <i>He is a student of the <b>occult</b>.</i>

<b>paganism</b>	A religion other than one of the main world religions, specifically a non-Christian or pre-Christian religion. <i>Modern <b>paganism</b> includes a respect for mother earth.</i>
<u><b>potion</b></u>	A medicinal or magical or poisonous beverage. <i>A healing <b>potion</b>.</i>
<u><b>shaman</b></u>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
<b>sleight</b>	The use of dexterity or cunning, especially so as to deceive. <i>Except by <b>sleight</b> of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
<u><b>sorcerer</b></u>	A person who claims or is believed to have magic powers; a wizard.
<b>sorcery</b>	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world.
<u><b>spell</b></u>	Place under a spell. <i>He whispered a <b>spell</b> as he moved his hands.</i>
<u><b>talisman</b></u>	A person regarded as representing and inspiring a particular group. <i>A dolphin <b>talisman</b> would ensure a safe journey on land or at sea.</i>
<u><b>witch</b></u>	A follower or practitioner of Wicca or of modern witchcraft. <i>He can marry the old <b>witch</b> for all I care.</i>
<u><b>wizard</b></u>	A help feature of a software package that automates complex tasks by asking the user a series of easy-to-answer questions. <i>How absolutely <b>wizard</b>.</i>
