## Associations of "With this in mind" (30 Words)

<b>absorbed</b>	Giving or marked by complete attention to. <i>The <b>absorbed</b> light intensity.</i>
<b>anxious</b>	Feeling or showing worry, nervousness, or unease about something with an uncertain outcome. <i><b>Anxious</b> to see the new show at the museum.</i>
<a href="#"><u>concentration</u></a>	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <i>The gas can collect in dangerous <b>concentrations</b>.</i>
<b>concerned</b>	Involved in or affected by or having a claim to or share in. <i>Greatly <b>concerned</b> not to disappoint a small child.</i>
<a href="#"><u>consciousness</u></a>	An alert cognitive state in which you are aware of yourself and your situation. <i>He lost <b>consciousness</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dejection</u></a>	A sad and depressed state; low spirits. <i>He was slumped in deep <b>dejection</b>.</i>
<b>disembodied</b>	Not having a material body. <i>A <b>disembodied</b> ghost.</i>
<a href="#"><u>disposed</u></a>	Naturally disposed toward. <i>He is favourably <b>disposed</b> towards the proposals.</i>
<a href="#"><u>excitable</u></a>	Easily excited. <i>These alkaloids act on nerve cells to make them more <b>excitable</b>.</i>
<b>focused</b>	Directing a great deal of attention, interest, or activity towards a particular aim. <i>The need for more <b>focused</b> research.</i>

<b>hypnosis</b>	The induction of a state of consciousness in which a person apparently loses the power of voluntary action and is highly responsive to suggestion or direction. Its use in therapy, typically to recover suppressed memories or to allow modification of behaviour, has been revived but is still controversial. <i>I was regressed under <b>hypnosis</b>.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	Having a preference, disposition, or tendency. <i><b>Inclined</b> to be moody.</i>
<b>incorporeal</b>	Having no physical existence. <i>An <b>incorporeal</b> spirit.</i>
<b>inland</b>	Carried on within the limits of a country; domestic. <i>The <b>inland</b> port of Gloucester.</i>
<b>intentionally</b>	Deliberately; on purpose. <i>I wasn't sure if it was <b>intentionally</b> funny or not.</i>
<b>internal</b>	Inner parts or features. <i>The nation's <b>internal</b> politics.</i>
<b>mental</b>	Done by or occurring in the mind. <i><b>Mental</b> images of happy times.</i>
<b>parapsychology</b>	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
<b>position</b>	An opinion that is held in opposition to another in an argument or dispute. <i>The company's financial <b>position</b> is grim.</i>
<b>preoccupation</b>	The state or condition of being preoccupied or engrossed with something. <i>Their main <b>preoccupation</b> was how to feed their families.</i>
<b>psyche</b>	That which is responsible for one's thoughts, feelings, and conscious brain functions; the seat of the faculty of reason. <i>How does constant losing affect the <b>psyches</b> of young athletes.</i>
<b>restlessly</b>	In a restless manner.
<b>semiconscious</b>	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
<b>sense</b>	Become aware of not through the senses but instinctively. <i>He hasn't got the <b>sense</b> God gave little green apples.</i>
<b>sensitize</b>	Make (an organism) abnormally sensitive to a foreign substance. <i>Long term exposure to this medicine may <b>sensitize</b> you to the allergen.</i>
<b>spirit</b>	Infuse with spirit. <i>The rule had been broken in <b>spirit</b> if not in letter.</i>

<b><u>subconscious</u></b>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. <i>Uncertainties were lurking around the edge of her <b>subconscious</b>.</i>
<b>think</b>	An instance of deliberate thinking. <i>Any writer who so rarely produces a book is not <b>thinking</b> deep thoughts.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in <b>thoughtful</b> consideration.</i>
<b><u>uneasy</u></b>	Lacking a sense of security or affording no ease or reassurance. <i>An <b>uneasy</b> coalition government.</i>
