### Definitions of "Withdrawn" as an adjective

- *Tending to reserve or introspection.*
- *Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude.*



## Synonyms of "Withdrawn" as an adjective (5 Words)

- indrawn** (of breath) taken in.  
*She heard the swift **indrawn** breath of surprise.*
- introverted** (of a community, company, or other group) concerned principally with its own affairs; inward-looking or parochial.
- recluse** Favouring a solitary life.
- reclusive** Avoiding the company of other people; solitary.  
*Sitting under the **reclusive** calm of a shade tree.*
- unsociable** Not inclined to society or companionship.  
***Unsociable** behavior.*





## Usage Examples of "Withdrawn" as an adjective

- *When her husband died she became very withdrawn.*



## Associations of "Withdrawn" (30 Words)

<b>antisocial</b>	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>He s not <b>antisocial</b> just shy.</i>
<b>behaviour</b>	Manner of acting or controlling yourself. <i>The erratic <b>behaviour</b> of the old car.</i>
<b>cagey</b>	Showing self-interest and shrewdness in dealing with others. <i>A spokesman was <b>cagey</b> about the arrangements his company had struck.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Of communal life sequestered from the world under religious vows. <i>A <b>cloistered</b> upbringing.</i>
<b>coy</b>	Reluctant to give details about something regarded as sensitive. <i>He is <b>coy</b> about his age.</i>
<b>demure</b>	(of clothing) giving a modest appearance. <i>A <b>demure</b> knee length skirt.</i>

<b>diffident</b>	Lacking self-confidence. <i>Stood in the doorway <b>diffident</b> and abashed.</i>
<b>hermit</b>	A reclusive or solitary person.
<b>introvert</b>	Turn inside. <i>He <b>introverted</b> his feelings.</i>
<b>introverted</b>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.
<b>passive</b>	The passive voice. <i><b>Passive</b> sensors detect the emissions from enemy radar.</i>
<b>psychopath</b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>The rock star was <b>quietly</b> led out the back door.</i>
<b>recluse</b>	Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude. <i>He s a bit of a <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b>reclusive</b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>He led a <b>reclusive</b> life.</i>
<b>reserved</b>	Marked by self-restraint and reticence-Victoria Sackville-West. <i>He is a <b>reserved</b> almost taciturn man.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Marked by avoidance of extravagance or extremes. <i>The drawings with their <b>restrained</b> colours give a feeling of peace and contemplation.</i>
<b>reticent</b>	Cool and formal in manner. <i>She was extremely <b>reticent</b> about her personal affairs.</i>
<b>retiring</b>	Shy and fond of being on one's own. <i>A shy <b>retiring</b> girl.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	Hidden from general view or use. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>shy</b>	Short. <i><b>Shy</b> of strangers.</i>
<b>silent</b>	Having a frequency below or above the range of human audibility. <i>A <b>silent</b> h.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	(of a flower or other part) borne singly. <i>A <b>solitary</b> speck in the sky.</i>



- taciturn** (of a person) reserved or uncommunicative in speech; saying little.  
*After such gatherings she would be **taciturn** and morose.*
- troglodyte** (especially in prehistoric times) a person who lived in a cave.
- unassertive** (of a person) not having or showing a confident and forceful personality.  
*A shy **unassertive** person.*
- uncommunicative** Not inclined to talk or give information or express opinions.  
*The **uncommunicative** Emily disappeared.*
- unfriendly** Very unfavorable to life or growth.  
*An **unfriendly** act of aggression.*
- unsociable** Not conducive to friendly social relations.  
*Generally **unsociable** except with intimate friends.*
- unsocial** Not seeking or given to association; being or living without companions.  
*The **unsocial** behaviour of young teenagers.*
