## Associations of "Withdrew" (30 Words)

<b>abjure</b>	Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure. <i>MPs were urged to <b>abjure</b> their Jacobite allegiance.</i>
<b>abolish</b>	Do away with. <i>Slavery was <b>abolished</b> in the mid 19th century in America and in Russia.</i>
<b>accuser</b>	Someone who imputes guilt or blame. <i>I dislike any law that puts the burden of proof on the accused rather than the <b>accuser</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">annihilate</a></b>	Kill in large numbers. <i>A simple bomb of this type could <b>annihilate</b> them all.</i>
<b>backdown</b>	An act of backing down. <i>Ministers have avoided sounding triumphal about the association s <b>backdown</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">cancel</a></b>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>A <b>cancel</b> title page.</i>
<b>capitulate</b>	Surrender under agreed conditions. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b><a href="#">disavow</a></b>	Deny any responsibility or support for. <i>Her husband <b>disavowed</b> her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
<b>disclaim</b>	Make a disclaimer about. <i>The school <b>disclaimed</b> any responsibility for his death.</i>
<b>disown</b>	Cast off. <i>Lovell s rich family had <b>disowned</b> him because of his marriage.</i>
<b><a href="#">exterminate</a></b>	Kill (a pest). <i>Hitler wanted to <b>exterminate</b> the Jews Gypsies Communists and homosexuals of Europe.</i>
<b>foreswear</b>	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>I am <b>foreswearing</b> women forever.</i>

<b>forswear</b>	Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure. <i>I swore that I would lead us safely home and I do not mean to be forsworn.</i>
<b>negate</b>	Deny the existence of. <i>Alcohol <b>negates</b> the effects of the drug.</i>
<b>quit</b>	Resign from (a job). <i><b>Quit</b> yourselves like men and fight.</i>
<b>recant</b>	Say that one no longer holds an opinion or belief, especially one considered heretical. <i>Galileo was forced to <b>recant</b> his assertion that the earth orbited the sun.</i>
<b>recantation</b>	A disavowal or taking back of a previous assertion. <i>Every writer interprets Galileo's <b>recantation</b> in a different way.</i>
<u>recede</u>	(of a quality, feeling, or possibility) gradually diminish. <i>His chin <b>receded</b> sharply from his lower lip.</i>
<b>relinquish</b>	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>I am <b>relinquishing</b> my bedroom to the long term house guest.</i>
<b>remove</b>	Remove from a position or an office. <i><b>Remove</b> a wrapper.</i>
<u>renounce</u>	Refuse or resign a right or position, especially one as an heir or trustee. <i>He <b>renounced</b> alcohol completely.</i>
<b>rescission</b>	The act of rescinding; the cancellation of a contract and the return of the parties to the positions they would have had if the contract had not been made. <i>The plaintiff agreed to the <b>rescission</b> of the agreement.</i>
<b>resign</b>	Part with a possession or right. <i><b>Resign</b> a claim to the throne.</i>
<b>retract</b>	Withdraw or go back on (an undertaking). <i>He <b>retracted</b> his earlier statements about his religion.</i>
<b>retraction</b>	A withdrawal of a statement, accusation, or undertaking. <i><b>Retraction</b> of the foreskin.</i>
<b>retreat</b>	Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity. <i>His proposals were clearly unreasonable and he was forced to <b>retreat</b>.</i>
<u>surrender</u>	The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy. <i>In 1815 Denmark <b>surrendered</b> Norway to Sweden.</i>
<b>swallow</b>	An act of swallowing something especially food or drink. <i>He seemed ready to <b>swallow</b> any insult.</i>
<u>waive</u>	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>He will <b>waive</b> all rights to the money.</i>

**withdrawal** The action of ceasing to participate in an activity.
