forswear Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure.

negate Deny the existence of.

Alcohol **negate**s the effects of the drug.

Resign from (a job.

Quit yourselves like men and fight.

Say that one no longer holds an opinion or belief, especially one considered

recant heretical.

Galileo was forced to **recant** his assertion that the earth orbited the sun.

recantation A disavowal or taking back of a previous assertion.

Every writer interprets Galileo s **recantation** in a different way.

recede (of a quality, feeling, or possibility) gradually diminish.

His chin **recede**d sharply from his lower lip.

relinguish Do without or cease to hold or adhere to.

I am **relinquish**ing my bedroom to the long term house guest.

Remove from a position or an office.

Remove a wrapper.

renounce Refuse or resign a right or position, especially one as an heir or trustee.

He **renounce**d alcohol completely.

The act of rescinding; the cancellation of a contract and the return of the

rescission parties to the positions they would have had if the contract had not been

made.

resign

The plaintiff agreed to the **rescission** of the agreement.

Part with a possession or right.

Resign a claim to the throne.

retract Withdraw or go back on (an undertaking.

He **retract**ed his earlier statements about his religion.

retraction A withdrawal of a statement, accusation, or undertaking.

Retraction of the foreskin.

retreat Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity.

His proposals were clearly unreasonable and he was forced to **retreat**.

The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy.
