Not leading to a firm conclusion or result; not ending doubt or dispute. inconclusive

Three years of **inconclusive** negotiations.

Doubt about the truth of something. incredulity

He stared down the street in **incredulity**.

Not disposed or willing to believe; unbelieving. incredulous

An **incredulous** gasp.

The trait of irresolution; a lack of firmness of character or purpose. indecision

His **indecision** was only momentary but the opportunity was lost.



Not precisely determined or established; not fixed or known in advance. The date of manufacture is indeterminate. indeterminate

Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide. <u>leery</u> A city **leery** of gang violence.

A feeling of doubt or apprehension about the outcome or consequences of

misgiving something.

We have **misgiving**s about the way the campaign is being run.

Doubt about someone's honesty. mistrust She had no cause to **mistrust** him.

A momentary faint or sick feeling. **qualm** 

Military regimes generally have no **qualm**s about controlling the press.

Able to be refuted.

**questionable** His **questionable** financial deals.

Marked by or given to doubt.

sceptical The public were deeply **sceptical** about some of the proposals.

Someone who habitually doubts accepted beliefs. skeptic

Marked by or given to doubt. <u>skeptical</u>

A **skeptical** attitude.

Hold in suspicion; believe to be guilty.

The US **suspect**ed Bin Laden as the mastermind behind the terrorist **suspect** 

attacks.

Doubt about someone's honesty. suspicion He tried to shield me from **suspicion**.

Having or showing a cautious distrust of someone or something. **suspicious** 

Suspicious behavior.

With a cautious distrust or suspicion of someone or something. suspiciously

He was arrested after behaving **suspiciously**.

Ambiguous (especially in the negative. uncertain

An **uncertain** future.

Being unsettled or in doubt or dependent on chance. uncertainty

Times of **uncertainty** and danger.

The trait of being unwilling.

unwillingness His **unwillingness** to cooperate vetoed every proposal I made.

Pancake batter baked in a waffle iron. waffle

He **waffle**d on about his problems.
