disbelief	Lack of faith. <i>Laura shook her head in disbelief.</i>
distrust	Doubt the honesty or reliability of; regard with suspicion. <i>The public s distrust of politicians.</i>
doubtful	Fraught with uncertainty or doubt. <i>I was doubtful of my judgement.</i>
dubiety	The state of being unsure of something. <i>His enemies made much of the dubiety of his paternity.</i>
dubious	Not to be relied upon; suspect. <i>Dubious about agreeing to go.</i>
equivocal	Uncertain or questionable in nature. <i>An equivocal statement.</i>
falter	Walk unsteadily. <i>He faltered and finally stopped in mid stride.</i>
hesitate	Pause or hold back in uncertainty or unwillingness. <i>She hesitated unsure of what to say.</i>
illegality	An illegal act or practice. <i>Proceedings will be required to establish the illegality of the act.</i>
inconclusive	Not leading to a firm conclusion or result; not ending doubt or dispute. <i>Three years of inconclusive negotiations.</i>
incredulity	Doubt about the truth of something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
incredulous	Not disposed or willing to believe; unbelieving. <i>An incredulous gasp.</i>
indecision	The trait of irresolution; a lack of firmness of character or purpose. <i>His indecision was only momentary but the opportunity was lost.</i>

indeterminate	Not precisely determined or established; not fixed or known in advance. <i>The date of manufacture is indeterminate.</i>
leery	Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide. <i>A city leery of gang violence.</i>
misgiving	A feeling of doubt or apprehension about the outcome or consequences of something. <i>We have misgivings about the way the campaign is being run.</i>
mistrust	Doubt about someone's honesty. <i>She had no cause to mistrust him.</i>
qualm	A momentary faint or sick feeling. <i>Military regimes generally have no qualms about controlling the press.</i>
questionable	Able to be refuted. <i>His questionable financial deals.</i>
sceptical	Marked by or given to doubt. <i>The public were deeply sceptical about some of the proposals.</i>
skeptic	Someone who habitually doubts accepted beliefs.
skeptical	Marked by or given to doubt. <i>A skeptical attitude.</i>
suspect	Hold in suspicion; believe to be guilty. <i>The U S suspected Bin Laden as the mastermind behind the terrorist attacks.</i>
suspicion	Doubt about someone's honesty. <i>He tried to shield me from suspicion.</i>
suspicious	Having or showing a cautious distrust of someone or something. <i>Suspicious behavior.</i>
suspiciously	With a cautious distrust or suspicion of someone or something. <i>He was arrested after behaving suspiciously.</i>
uncertain	Ambiguous (especially in the negative). <i>An uncertain future.</i>
uncertainty	Being unsettled or in doubt or dependent on chance. <i>Times of uncertainty and danger.</i>
unwillingness	The trait of being unwilling. <i>His unwillingness to cooperate vetoed every proposal I made.</i>
waffle	Pancake batter baked in a waffle iron. <i>He waffled on about his problems.</i>
