handle	Handle effectively. That s some handle for a baby.
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. A divorced man paying his ex wife 2 500 a year maintenance .
manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. She manage d a brave but unconvincing smile.



obstinacy	Resolute adherence to your own ideas or desires. <i>His reputation for obstinacy</i> .
patience	Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. I have run out of patience with her.
patiently	With patience; in a patient manner. <i>He patiently explained the pros and cons.</i>
perseverance	Persistent determination. Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance .
persevere	Be persistent, refuse to stop. His family persevere d with his treatment.
<u>persist</u>	Be persistent refuse to stop. We are persist ing with policies that will create jobs for the future.
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff s persistence</i> was rewarded with a try.
recalcitrance	The trait of being unmanageable.
<u>resist</u>	Resist immunologically the introduction of some foreign tissue or organ. We will continue to resist changes to the treaty.
<u>stamina</u>	Enduring strength and energy. Their secret is stamina rather than speed.
struggle	Make a strenuous or labored effort. It was a struggle to make herself understood.
<u>survival</u>	A natural process resulting in the evolution of organisms best adapted to the environment. <i>His shorts were a survival from his army days.</i>
<u>survive</u>	Manage to keep going in difficult circumstances. <i>He survived the cancer against all odds.</i>
<u>sustain</u>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. His health will no longer enable him to sustain the heavy burdens of office.
<u>tolerate</u>	Have a tolerance for a poison or strong drug or pathogen or environmental condition. <i>A regime unwilling to tolerate dissent.</i>
toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. The king demanded greater religious toleration .



tribulation	A cause of great trouble or suffering. His time of tribulation was just beginning.
<u>upkeep</u>	The process of keeping something in good condition. <i>Payments for the children s</i> upkeep .
