## Associations of "Woke" (30 Words)

<u>afternoon</u>	In the afternoon every afternoon. I telephoned this <b>afternoon</b> .
arouse	To begin moving. <i>Arouse</i> pity.
<u>awake</u>	Not in a state of sleep; completely conscious. The noise might keep you <b>awake</b> at night.
awaken	Rouse (a feeling. Anna was <b>awaken</b> ed by the telephone.
<u>bedtime</u>	The usual time when someone goes to bed. A <b>bedtime</b> story.
dawn	Become light. <i>He set off at <b>dawn</b>.</i>
day	The part of a day when it is light the time between sunrise and sunset. <i>He deserves his day in court.</i>
daybreak	The time in the morning when daylight first appears; dawn. <i>She set off at daybreak</i> .
friday	The sixth day of the week; the fifth working day.
<u>midnight</u>	Twelve o'clock at night. Young children should not be allowed to stay up until <b>midnight</b> .
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
<u>morning</u>	Every morning. They talked until <b>morning</b> .
nap	A period of time spent sleeping. <i>Excuse me I ll just take a little <b>nap</b>.</i>
<u>night</u>	Roman goddess of night daughter of Erebus counterpart of Greek Nyx. Investments that won t keep us awake <b>night</b> s with worry.



noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon</i> .
o'clock	According to the clock.
rouse	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>His evasiveness <b>rouse</b>d my curiosity.</i>
saturday	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
sleep	Typically in the context of anticipating a forthcoming event a night or a night s sleep. They had to put their family pet to <b>sleep</b> .
<u>slumber</u>	Sleep. Sleeping Beauty <b>slumber</b> ed in her forest castle.
sunday	First day of the week; observed as a day of rest and worship by most Christians.
<u>sunrise</u>	The time in the morning when the sun appears or full daylight arrives. <i>An hour before</i> <b>sunrise</b> .
<u>tomorrow</u>	The day after today. I have work to do <b>tomorrow</b> morning.
tonight	The present or immediately coming night. <b>Tonight</b> is a night to remember.
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
waken	Cause to become awake or conscious. They combined to <b>waken</b> a forgotten and futile hope.
waking	The state of remaining awake. Days of danger and nights of <b>waking</b> .
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
weekday	Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday. <i>The <b>weekday</b> rush hour.</i>
yesterday	On the day before today. <b>Yesterday</b> s best sellers.
