| competitive | Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>Highly competitive sales representative.</i> |
| contention | A point asserted as part of an argument. <i>The captured territory was the main area of contention between the two countries.</i> |
| contest | An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>She declared her intention to contest the presidency.</i> |
| gain | Win something through one's efforts. <i>She gained 20 pounds when she stopped exercising.</i> |
| gamely | In a brave, spirited way. <i>I scribbled madly gamely trying to keep up.</i> |
| jubilant | Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i> |
| jubilation | A feeling of extreme joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of jubilation.</i> |
| opposing | In conflict or competition with someone or something. <i>Opponent or opposing armies.</i> |
| outmaneuver | Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops outmaneuvered the Germans.</i> |
| rejoicing | Great joy; jubilation. <i>The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general rejoicing.</i> |
| rivalry | Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. <i>There always has been intense rivalry between the clubs.</i> |
| succeed | Attain fame, wealth, or social status. <i>He would succeed Hawke as Prime Minister.</i> |

| trophy | Something given as a token of victory. |
| victor | A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication. <i>There were many dead on the field but no clear victor.</i> |
| victory | A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>Clinched a victory.</i> |
| winner | A card that can be relied on to win a trick. <i>Anyone taking out a fixed rate mortgage could be on to a winner.</i> |
