outmaneuver

Defeat by more skillful maneuvering.

The English troops **outmaneuver**ed the Germans.

rejoicing Great joy; jubilation.

The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general **rejoicing**.

**rivalry**Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field.

To express great joy. **triumph**

Something given as a token of victory. trophy

Two of their **triumphant** Cup team.

A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication. victor

There were many dead on the field but no clear **victor**.

A successful ending of a struggle or contest. **victory**
