### **Definitions of "Won" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “won” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The basic unit of money in North Korea.*
- *A victory (as in a race or other competition).*
- *The basic unit of money in South Korea.*
- *Something won (especially money).*



### Synonyms of "Won" as a noun (2 Words)

- north korean won** The region of the United States lying to the north of the Mason-Dixon line.
- south korean won** The region of the United States lying to the south of the Mason-Dixon line.

<b>accomplishment</b>	The action of accomplishing something. <i>Long distance running was another of her <b>accomplishments</b>.</i>
<b>achieve</b>	To gain with effort. <i>He <b>achieved</b> his ambition to become a press photographer.</i>
<b>achievement</b>	The process or fact of achieving something. <i>Assessing ability in terms of academic <b>achievement</b>.</i>
<b>achiever</b>	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
<b>acquirement</b>	The action of acquiring something. <i>The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>acquisition</b> of wealth.</i>

<b>attain</b>	Succeed in achieving (something that one has worked for). <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attaining</b> them.</i>
<b>attainment</b>	The action or fact of achieving a goal towards which one has worked. <i>He spoke of the low educational <b>attainments</b> of his workforce.</i>
<b>blowout</b>	An easy victory. <i>The game had been a <b>blowout</b>.</i>
<b>clinch</b>	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>Breaking from a <b>clinch</b> he crossed with his right.</i>
<b>competition</b>	A business relation in which two parties compete to gain customers. <i>He wanted to know what the <b>competition</b> was doing.</i>
<b>competitive</b>	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>Highly <b>competitive</b> sales representative.</i>
<b>contention</b>	A point asserted as part of an argument. <i>The captured territory was the main area of <b>contention</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>contest</b>	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>She declared her intention to <b>contest</b> the presidency.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Win something through one's efforts. <i>She <b>gained</b> 20 pounds when she stopped exercising.</i>
<b>gamely</b>	In a brave, spirited way. <i>I scribbled madly <b>gamely</b> trying to keep up.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>jubilation</b>	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b>.</i>
<b>opposing</b>	In conflict or competition with someone or something. <i>Opponent or <b>opposing</b> armies.</i>
<b>outmaneuver</b>	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops <b>outmaneuvered</b> the Germans.</i>
<b>rejoicing</b>	Great joy; jubilation. <i>The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general <b>rejoicing</b>.</i>
<b>rivalry</b>	Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. <i>There always has been intense <b>rivalry</b> between the clubs.</i>
<b>succeed</b>	Attain fame, wealth, or social status. <i>He would <b>succeed</b> Hawke as Prime Minister.</i>

<b>success</b>	An attainment that is successful. <i>The good or ill <b>success</b> of their maritime enterprises.</i>
<b>triumph</b>	To express great joy. <i>The marriage had been a <b>triumph</b> of togetherness.</i>
<b>triumphant</b>	Having won a battle or contest; victorious. <i>Two of their <b>triumphant</b> Cup team.</i>
<b>trophy</b>	Something given as a token of victory.
<b>victor</b>	A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication. <i>There were many dead on the field but no clear <b>victor</b>.</i>
<b>victory</b>	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>Clinched a <b>victory</b>.</i>
<b>winner</b>	A card that can be relied on to win a trick. <i>Anyone taking out a fixed rate mortgage could be on to a <b>winner</b>.</i>
