## Associations of "Work on" (30 Words)

<a href="#">accomplish</a>	Achieve or complete successfully. <i>The planes <b>accomplished</b> their mission.</i>
<b>assiduity</b>	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The <b>assiduity</b> with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
<a href="#">assiduous</a>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i><b>Assiduous</b> research.</i>
<a href="#">chore</a>	A routine task, especially a household one. <i>The early risers were up and about doing their <b>chores</b>.</i>
<b>collaborate</b>	Cooperate traitorously with an enemy. <i>He <b>collaborated</b> with him on numerous hotel projects.</i>
<a href="#">cooperatively</a>	In close cooperation. <i>The two publishers will work <b>cooperatively</b> on poster projects.</i>
<b>diligent</b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After <b>diligent</b> searching he found a parcel.</i>
<b>employed</b>	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Most of our graduates are <b>employed</b>.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The action of giving work to someone. <i>He travelled in a variety of <b>employments</b>.</i>
<a href="#">engaged</a>	Having ones attention or mind or energy engaged. <i>Keith and I had got <b>engaged</b> four months before.</i>
<b>hired</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>hired</b> assassin.</i>
<a href="#">interact</a>	Act in such a way as to have an effect on each other. <i>All the stages in the process <b>interact</b>.</i>
<b>job</b>	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>If left unfettered he would <b>job</b>.</i>

<b>labor</b>	A political party formed in Great Britain in 1900 characterized by the promotion of labor's interests and formerly the socialization of key industries. <i>There is a shortage of skilled <b>labor</b> in this field.</i>
<b><u>menial</u></b>	A person with a menial job. <i><b>Menial</b> factory jobs.</i>
<b>overtime</b>	Payment for overtime. <i>His brain was working <b>overtime</b>.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	A contract between two or more persons who agree to pool talent and money and share profits or losses. <i>An increase in <b>partnerships</b> with housing associations.</i>
<b><u>proletariat</u></b>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>
<b><u>reconstruction</u></b>	The action or process of reconstructing or being reconstructed. <i>A <b>reconstruction</b> of the accident would be staged to try to discover the cause of the tragedy.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	Someone who supplies members or employees. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The action of finding new people to join an organization or support a cause. <i>The black tailed deer is notoriously capable of population <b>recruitment</b> after numbers are depleted.</i>
<b>scullion</b>	A servant assigned the most menial kitchen tasks.
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A <b>semiskilled</b> job.</i>
<b>subcontract</b>	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i><b>Subcontract</b> work.</i>
<b>successfully</b>	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has <b>successfully</b> completed her mission.</i>
<b>task</b>	Assign a task to. <i>A new manager was given the <b>task</b> of developing the club's talent.</i>
<b>toil</b>	Productive work (especially physical work done for wages). <i>She began to <b>toil</b> up the cliff path.</i>
<b>travail</b>	Painful or laborious effort. <i>Advice for those who wish to save great sorrow and <b>travail</b>.</i>
<b><u>unskilled</u></b>	Not doing a good job. <i><b>Unskilled</b> in the art of rhetoric.</i>
