accomplish	Achieve or complete successfully. <i>The planes accomplished their mission.</i>
assiduity	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
assiduous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Assiduous research.</i>
chore	A routine task, especially a household one. <i>The early risers were up and about doing their chores.</i>
collaborate	Cooperate traitorously with an enemy. <i>He collaborated with him on numerous hotel projects.</i>
cooperatively	In close cooperation. <i>The two publishers will work cooperatively on poster projects.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After diligent searching he found a parcel.</i>
employed	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Most of our graduates are employed.</i>
employment	The action of giving work to someone. <i>He travelled in a variety of employments.</i>
engaged	Having ones attention or mind or energy engaged. <i>Keith and I had got engaged four months before.</i>
hired	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A hired assassin.</i>
interact	Act in such a way as to have an effect on each other. <i>All the stages in the process interact.</i>
job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>If left unfettered he would job.</i>

labor	A political party formed in Great Britain in 1900 characterized by the promotion of labor's interests and formerly the socialization of key industries. <i>There is a shortage of skilled labor in this field.</i>
<u>menial</u>	A person with a menial job. <i>Menial factory jobs.</i>
overtime	Payment for overtime. <i>His brain was working overtime.</i>
partnership	A contract between two or more persons who agree to pool talent and money and share profits or losses. <i>An increase in partnerships with housing associations.</i>
<u>proletariat</u>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
<u>reconstruction</u>	The action or process of reconstructing or being reconstructed. <i>A reconstruction of the accident would be staged to try to discover the cause of the tragedy.</i>
recruiter	Someone who supplies members or employees. <i>A recruiter will schedule you for an interview.</i>
recruitment	The action of finding new people to join an organization or support a cause. <i>The black tailed deer is notoriously capable of population recruitment after numbers are depleted.</i>
scullion	A servant assigned the most menial kitchen tasks.
semiskilled	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A semiskilled job.</i>
subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>Subcontract work.</i>
successfully	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has successfully completed her mission.</i>
task	Assign a task to. <i>A new manager was given the task of developing the club's talent.</i>
toil	Productive work (especially physical work done for wages). <i>She began to toil up the cliff path.</i>
travail	Painful or laborious effort. <i>Advice for those who wish to save great sorrow and travail.</i>
<u>unskilled</u>	Not doing a good job. <i>Unskilled in the art of rhetoric.</i>
